### FLYING POPULAR

LONDON, Feb. 21 — The popularity of flying as a means of commercial travel may be judged by the fact that 12,528 passengers arrived and departed from the Croyden Aerodrome during the year 1922. To carry this number of passengers 4,193 flights were made. Flying, nevertheless, is not yet a paying business for the airplane companies. The government allows them subsidies which cover their actual losses.

In the future all airplanes flying over England at night will carry white rear lights on each wing tip and on the tail. This is a new regulation of the Air Ministry.

The ministry is about to establish a permanent gliding station at Luton Hill, where the gliding contests were held last October. Sheds and workshops will be erected, and the station will be utilized not only by the Royal Air Force but by private experimenters, who will be able to try out their gliders and use the workshops and hauling trolleys attached to the

### Board Appointed To Supervise Expenditures

WINNIPEG, Feb. 21 — The establishment of a local government board in Manitoba to supervise all expenditures in towns, villages and municipalities will be brought before the government caucus by Chas. Cannon, Chairman of Municipal Committee of the Legislature. It is proposed to keep the municipalities from entering into liabilities which they were not in a financial position to undertake. Similar boards are in operation in England and other parts of Europe.

The Board would consist of municipal and financial experts. They would review all proposed municipal expenditures from districts and would be permitted to raise funds to carry them out.

### German Policy Is Weakening

DUSSELDORF, Feb. 21 — The French have won the first round of the economic battle in the Ruhr. The German policy of passive resistance has commenced to crumble as the vital industries are undermined. Some new issue from the struggle now is being sought by both the extremists and moderates.

Two plans for the future are being urged, apparently the only ones left open to Germany, they are either active resistance or peace negotiations through open mediation by outside powers. The extremists, nationalists and communists alike are urging open warfare as far as possible to carry on the tactics. The moderates, comprising the bulk of the people are talking of mediation and pour parlers and the necessity of diplomatic peace before the Ruhr and the other German industries are ruined.

### Checking Canada's Coal Imports

BRIDGEBURG, Ont., Feb. 21 — It became known today that representatives of the New York State Fuel commission have been at the border investigating the flow of coal to Canada, getting figures at first hand for themselves. Investigation made at the border here shows that on an average, about 150 carloads of soft coal and about the same number of carloads of hard coal are crossing over the International Bridge at

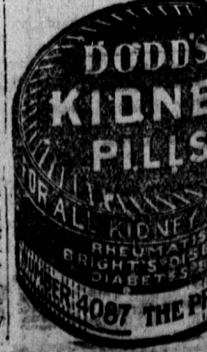
