TRAIN AND STEAMER ARRANGEMENTS.

Under the autumn time table on the P. E. Island Railway which goes into effect on Monday morning, next, the arrangements for travel between this Province and Sydney and Halifax will be somewhat thrown out of joint.

It would seem that a better arrangement might be made by an earlier departure of the boat. If for instance the Northumberland were timed to leave Charlottetown about 6.30 in the morning, passengers would reach Pictou in time to take the 10.20 train for Sydney, reaching that city at 7.45 same evening, and thus going through without delay.

EXPRESS RATES IN CANADA.

"The Illinois railway and warehouse commission, a state body having control of freight and express rates within the commonwealth so far as commerce other than interstate is concerned, has just ordered a fifty per cent. reduction in express rates within the boundaries of Illinois.

"More than a year has passed since the last of the sittings of the commission in this express muling probe. No decision has yet been handed down. The Illinois commission reported promptly. The Canadian commission has yet to deliver its findings. There are two ways of doing things."

The above is from the Toronto World and shows how hard and slow a job it is to effect any check upon the rapacity of the express companies even in the west. It also raises the most unpleasant impression that the control of the express companies extends into the official sphere in some mysterious and sinister way.

PORTUGAL A REPUBLIC.

The revolution in Portugal has done its work very swiftly. It had evidently been working in secret and had obtained control of both the army and the navy, or at least such portions of them as were stationed at Lisbon. The result is that almost with the swiftness of a thunderbolt the monarchy has been overthrown and a republic proclaimed, with the

business and considerable passenger traffic between this Province and Sydney, such detention is extremely inconvenient to all concerned.

It may be thought that 6.30 in the morning would be a rather early hour for the steamer's departure, but this would have its advantage in giving more time for the unloading and loading of the steamer at Pictou during a period when the freight traffic is usually very heavy. By the proposed arrangement the outward connection for Halifax would not be so good as for Sydney. There would, in fact be some four hours delay, but this would give opportunity for some business at Pictou, Stellarton or New Glasgow, one or other of which places many passengers from the Island desire to visit.

One thing is certain: the autumn train arrangements here and the present time of departure of the Northumberland will together make an exceedingly bad combination, about as slow and dilatory as could be devised. The proposed change in the time of the boat is suggested as the best means available to make travelling conditions between this Province and Sydney fairly tolerable.

him go to a store where he is not known, wearing a mask and refusing to give his name while asking for goods on credit and note what manner of reception he will get.

Experience in the newspaper business enforces the lesson that the anonymous writer is generally as we have said a coward and a contemptible creature. And the action of sending for publication without the writer's name in confidence is little short of an insult to the man to whom it is addressed. These are the reasons why all anonymous letters received by respectable newspapers are consigned promptly to the wastebasket.

It is not always necessary, however, that the name of the writer should be published with his letter. In some cases, though they are but few, the writer's name need not be printed. But it must be known to the editor, as evidence of the good faith of the writer, and for further reference afterward, if necessary. And just as the writer's name, given in confidence is an evidence of good faith, so the withholding of his name by the writer is evidence of bad faith and of a sinister object in writing.

C. P. R. IS SENDING MILLIONS OF MONEY.

MONTREAL, Oct. 5.--The Canadian Pacific Railway Company is spending millions of money in and around Montreal, to keep pace with the phenomenal growth of the city as a commercial centre. The increased accommodation at Place Viger and the additional to Windsor Street Station are costing between three and four millions, and another enterprise, which will cost \$2,500,000, is the new bridge over the St. Lawrence at Lachine.

The Company for months past has had contractors working on the double tracking of the bridge. The undertaking is a gigantic one, necessitating as it does the widening of the piers and the construction of additional ones to increase the support. The new structure will not be completed until the spring of 1912. The conditions under which the contractors work are dangerous and difficult, as the work of erecting the new piers and widening the old ones necessitates operations in the river at a place where being situated but a short distance above the Lachine Rapids. Some eight or ten divers are employed constantly sinking coffer dams and inspecting and clearing away the foundations for the new work.

CHARGED WITH SALE OF NEWSPAPER TIPS.

TORONTO, October 5--An attempt is still being made by the Morality Department to put a stop to the sale of racing information. After the newsboys who were tried last week for selling New York telegrams had been sent back to the United States, Staff Inspector Kennedy continued his investigation, and he issued summonses for a number of hotel news agents. These men were F. Waldorf, of the Imperial Hotel; Charles Dean, of the Walker House; Melvin Luttrell, of the Ironquois Hotel; and Thomas White, of the King Edward. The alleged information consists of the form chart and record of past performances of the horses racing at the Woodbine, printed on an inside page of the New York Telegraph. This paper has been sold at the above-mentioned news stands, it is claimed. The men were all bound over to appear for trial on Monday Oct 10th.

ALL-RED WIRELESS AT A CENT A WORD.

GEORGETOWN, British Guiana, October 5--The Chamber of Commerce has resolved in view of the report of the trade commission to ask the British Government to subsidize a direct trans-Atlantic mail service by any company whatsoever. A bluebook issued in connection with the West Indies trade commission gives particulars of the proposals of the Bessenden Wireless Company for an All-red wireless route. The company believes it will be eventually able to take messages for a half penny a word between Britain, Canada and the West Indies.

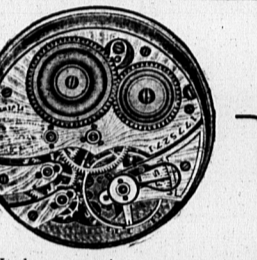

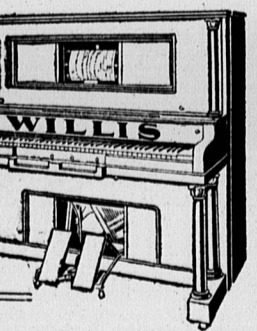
