NEW YORK, April 19—Dumont earned \$1.34 in March.

DETROIT, April 19—Earnings of Packard Motor first quarter were in the neighborhood of twice of those in corresponding period a year ago. The president states at annual meeting. In first quarter 1936 earnings were \$1,248,000 or eight cents a share on 15,000,000 shares.

CHICAGO, April 19—The very profitable pace set by International Harvester in the first 5-1-2 months of its new fiscal year indicates that it could well afford to boost its \$2.50 annual dividend rate on the common or disburse an extra dividend to the stockholders before the current year closes. No intimation that such development might take place has been forthcoming from officials of the company. Moreover, it is policy in the past to retain for surplus a good portion of profits when times are good.

Copper Nickel exports—Nickel exports for March were up over \$100,000, at \$6,280,955 and copper gained over \$2,300,000 at \$5,279,000 compared to March 1936. For the year ended March 1937 nickel was ahead about \$4,200,000 and copper \$9,000,000 as compared with the year previous.

MORNING MARKET LETTER

The market continued to display a waiting tendency on Saturday, still showing a good deal of firmness.

The appearance of more stability in the Wheat Market is contrast to the weakness of Friday, and a better Liverpool Market for Cotton were factors promoting confidence.

The Copper stocks however, lost ground evidently on the belief that a further reduction in the price of the metal is a near term possibility.

The Rails resisted selling and there was a suggestion of buoyancy in the motion picture stocks.

The new week is likely to start with a showing of hesitation in our opinion, due to the continuing gold and budget uncertainties but the fundamental business condition is encouraging, and over recent weeks many individual stocks have been corrected marketwise to a point where buying might be induced on even mildly favorable developments.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were quoted at 22 cents a dozen for A-large, 20 to 20 1-2 for A-medium, 18 1-2 for A-pullets or grade B and 17 1-2 for C.

Butter was quoted at 25 to 26 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 while lots to retailers were 26 to 27 for solids and 27 to 28 for prints.

Cheese was quoted at 13 1-4 to 1-2 cents a pound for Ontarios while Quebecs were unquoted.

Much enlarged export demand for Canadian wheat was an outstanding late factor, together with astonishing reversal of trend in transatlantic markets. May delivery of wheat led the upturns of wheat prices here.

At the close, wheat was 1 cent to 2 7-8 above Saturday's finish. May 133 3-8 to 5-8, July 121 3-8 to 1-2, corn 3-4 to 3 cents up, May 127 3-4 to 7-8, July 117 1-2 to 5-8 and oats 1 cent off to 5 cents up.

WINNIPEG, April 19 (CP)—Purchase by continental houses of all Canadian wheat offerings during the week-end and soaring overseas markets led to a brisk rally in wheat prices on the Winnipeg grain exchange today.

Huge foreign buying pushed Canadian wheat exports to nearly 2,000,000 bushels before trading closed with values 5-8 to 2 1-4 cents higher. May wheat finished at
