Liquor Seizures During Year 1928

During the year 1928 searches were made of dwelling houses, shops, warehouses and other public places suspected of selling liquor. 153 seizures were made, the major part of which was rum, ranging from one pint to ninety gallons.

178 prosecutions were instituted against violators of the Prohibition Act which resulted in 117 convictions and 61 dismissals. Of the convictions 93 were for first offences involving a penalty of from \$200 to \$500; 24 were for second offences and received from six to eight months in jail.

Nine convicted offenders are still at large. In some cases the commitments have been stayed by the Commission. The others will be executed as soon as possible.

Six parties have absconded to avoid the unpleasantness of a term in jail and have not yet returned.

Nine offenders convicted for offences under the Act have applied for a writ of Certiorari, to have the convictions made against them quashed.

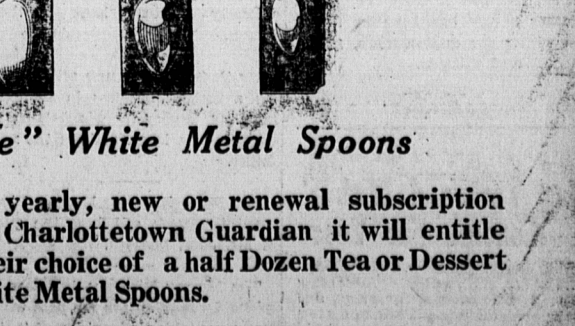
