Notre Dame Keeps Victory Record Intact

NEW YORK, Nov. 13 (CP)—Crashing through a great Minnesota team for three touchdowns and a 19-0 defeat Notre Dame emerged from Saturday's phase of the United States college football campaign as the best Irish team since 1930.

Other teams still undefeated and vying with Notre Dame in the race for National honors as the campaign reaches the testing stage are Texas Christian, Tennessee, Duke and Oklahoma. After last week's surprise defeat at the hands of Carnegie Tech, Pittsburgh took no chances and turned on the power from the start to beat Nebraska 19-0. Duke, their line unbreached for the season, outlasted Syracuse to win 21-0. All Duke scores came as a climax to long drives.

The fourth tug was between Hopfield, but although the Lower Bedeque boys put up a spirited contest, they were no match for the smooth working Hopfield team which apparently had had considerable training, and Hopfield won the tug and the Trophy for the third and final time.
