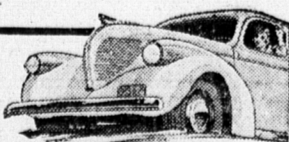

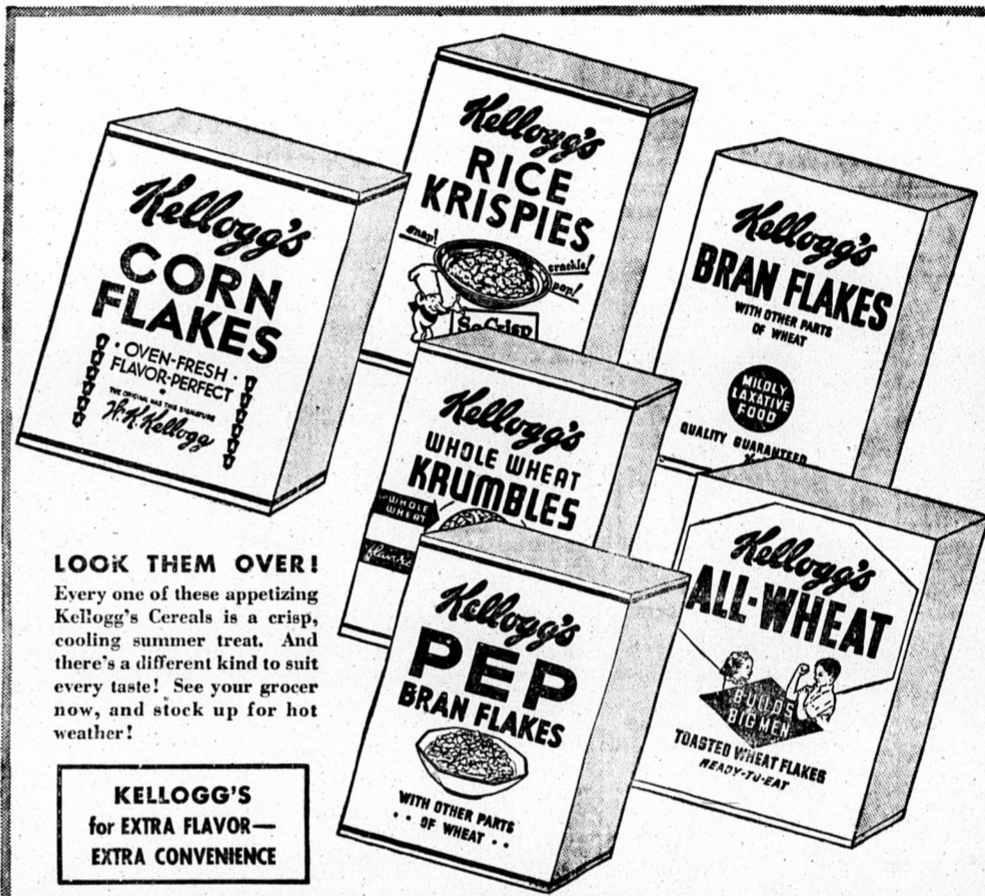

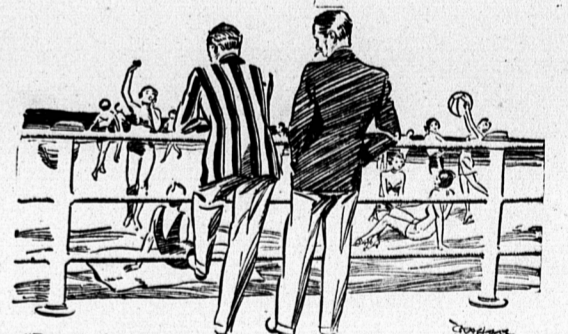
The eagle accidentally killed the gosling in attempting to lift it into the nest. Her sharp talons pierced the tiny lungs.

Miss E. L. Holmes, secretary of Edmonton Exhibition association, said there was no doubt the death of gosling No. 1 was accidental, and that Old Goldy's maternal zeal in the pair's behalf had been

as ardent as if they had been her own.

"It was an interesting experiment, but it proved its point and we felt there was nothing to gain

by continuing it further," she said. Presence of the tender young geese in the eagle's pen was also driving the hawks in an adjoining cage crazy she added.
