Farm Federation Watching Strike Situation Closely

The present strike in Maritime packing plants means a critical blow to Prince Edward Island and hog producers if settlement is not reached within a very few days. This was the decision reached at a special meeting of the Prince Edward Island Federation of Agriculture called Saturday to consider the crisis from the farmers' standpoint.

Eighteen members of the twenty-one man board were present and discussed local conditions and the Provincial circumstances from a national viewpoint. The Canadian Federation of Agriculture and the Provincial Government were contacted and asked to do everything in its power to have a settlement negotiated. In the meantime the Provincial Federation is making every effort to bring about necessary negotiations and settlement.
