The Summerside Town Council on Monday last sold the town team to J. J. Ritchie, Newcastle, N. B., for the sum of \$440. The price was a satisfactory one and the team are well worth it.

A MINISTERIAL BARGAIN.

Some time ago a church was without a minister. The chairman of the supply committee wrote to the denominational headquarters describing the type of preacher the church needed and must have. The type described was an admirable combination of the Apostle Paul and a first class captain of industry. He was also to be a married man in the first flush of vigorous manhood. One church gives promise of having reached a sound business basis. Whether the religious product will justify this commercial experiment will be a matter of future history.—Boston Transcript.
