

# Worthy Ermine Winner of Junior Free-For-All Event

## Nell Kalmuck Wins Free-For-All Trot In Fine Night Card

Nell Kalmuck, forging from behind in her usual manner, captured the Free-For-All Trot at the night meeting of the first day of the Goodwill Races yesterday. The Willard Kelly-driven mare had just a bit too much brush for the other entrants; in the first mile she shaded Eva Worthy in a grueling drive from the seven-eighths pole home and came on in the second mile to beat out Lusticia by inches in another blanket finish.

As was the case in the afternoon racing was of a high order with driving finishes preeminent and upsets occurring regularly especially as far as the second place horses were concerned. Feather Duster, showing plenty of trotting ability was 1-1, in capturing the 2:20 trot; the 2:25 pace was split up affair with Random Harvest winning the first dash and Joey Harvester, showing all kinds of pacing ability, coping the second, while in the second division of the 2:25-2:27 pace Abegwit Milady, in an upset victory, paced off with both heats in convincing fashion over a nine-horse field that despite Milady's strait heat win, produced some of the keenest competition of the evening.

Another double program is scheduled for today with the Free-For-All Pace headlining the afternoon card, a race that is expected to produce the utmost in racing thrills, while in the evening another great card has been drawn up that will assure the fans of loads of racing action.

### 2:20 Trot

**First Heat:** Feather Duster, after taking the lead at the second turn, was never headed. Prince Marine moved up to second place, followed by Joandale and the first three never changed positions. Feather Duster won by two lengths with Prince Marine half a length to the rear over Joandale. The remainder due to breaks, were well strung out.

**Second Heat:** It was Feather Duster all the way. He lost the lead briefly to Reuben Lee at the second turn but came on again to make every post a winning one with Reuben retaining his second slot.

**Third Heat:** Feather Duster made it a grand slam as he came through in the stretch to head Reuben Lee, who had led all the way, by a head, with San Ton landing the third spot. All three were closely bunched and it was another of the good heats that had been witnessed all season.

### Free-For-All Trot

**First Heat:** Lee Brewer gave the crowd a big lead in the first mile going it in 1:03 but the tide changed in the second half. Lee started to fade with Eva Worthy and Nell Kalmuck going to the front and from there it was a two-horse affair with Nell going to the front at the top of the stretch to beat out Lusticia by an inch in a rousing finish.

**Second Heat:** It was Nell Kalmuck again but only by the narrowest of margins over Lusticia. After wrestling the lead from Eva Worthy at the quarter pole, led to within twenty yards of the wire before yielding to Nell's closing burst. Eva Worthy was third with Wait N' See and Lee Brewer finishing in that order.

### 2:28 Pace (1st Division)

**First Heat:** Bonnie Clegg went to the front at the second turn to lead the six-horse field around to the half but here Random Harvest took over to make every post a winning one. Hilda Mac was second a length back with Joey Harvester, far back at the start, going a terrific mile to place third among the closely-packed field.

**Second Heat:** Joey Harvester, again getting away behind showed his worth as he moved up to third at the quarter; pulled out again at the half, took over from Bonnie Clegg halfway up the backstretch to out-pace the field the rest of the way. Hilda Mac was second. Random Harvest after a couple of bad breaks led the field through fourth and Simon Budlong fifth.

### 2:25-2:27 Pace (2nd Division)

**First Heat:** A further upset was thrown at the crowd as Abegwit Milady, getting away on top, made every post a winning one. Ma Cheri, one of the co-favorites, tried

to take over as they hit the backstretch the second trip but Abegwit shook her off and was just too good in the stretch with Lillian Budlong coping second in the bunched field.

**Second Heat:** It was another great finish as Abegwit Milady, after trailing most of the way, came with a great burst of speed to cop the lead from Ed McL. after the latter had led most of the way. Miss Cherry Valley was third with the remainder packed closely a couple of strides behind.

NEW YORK, Sept. 14 (AP)—The wild-eyed Rocky Graziano of old returned just in time to stop Charlie Fusari in 2:04 of the 10th round tonight at the Polo Grounds in a furious brawl. Referee Ruby Goldstein stepped in to save Fusari from serious damage as he stood helplessly in a neutral corner after taking a savage left-cross beating.

Knowing well that only a knock-out could win, the ring-rusty Rocky, returning to a New York ring after a three-year exile, exploded his old wild fury in the 10th.

Draping Fusari over the ropes with a two-fisted attack, Graziano dropped Charlie for nine. He just did beat the count. Then he went after him again, pinning him in a neutral corner under a deluge of sledge-hammer blows.

It was a replica of the first Joe Louis-Billy Conn fight with Fusari apparently out front in points, taking one chance too many. He had been shaking off the Rock's Sunday punches all night long. But he did it once too often.
