CAPE Breton is likely to have another city. North Sydney and Sydney Mines are considering the idea of becoming amalgamated and forming a city under a new name, in which Sydney will not appear. If the federation takes place, the new city will have a population of about 15,000.

THE estate of the late Admiral Bayfield has been purchased from its recent owner Oliver Rattenbury by J. K. Ross for \$2800. The estate is composed of the fine old residence on the corner of Euston and Queen Street with the two adjacent building lots on Queen Street. Mr. Ross intends to erect a residence for himself on that site.

THE Halifax Herald is in error when it states the following: Among the attractions of Tuesday, the opening day of the Charlottetown Exhibition, will be three boxing bouts. The bouts will be of 3, 5 and 7 rounds respectively, and will be for purses of \$100, \$150 and \$200. The men who will spar are J. J. THE City of London returned from Crapaud yesterday forenoon with twenty-five passengers and a cargo which included fifteen head of live stock, 100 boxes butter from Crapaud Creamery for Halifax, 25 boxes for local use and 100 cases of eggs. 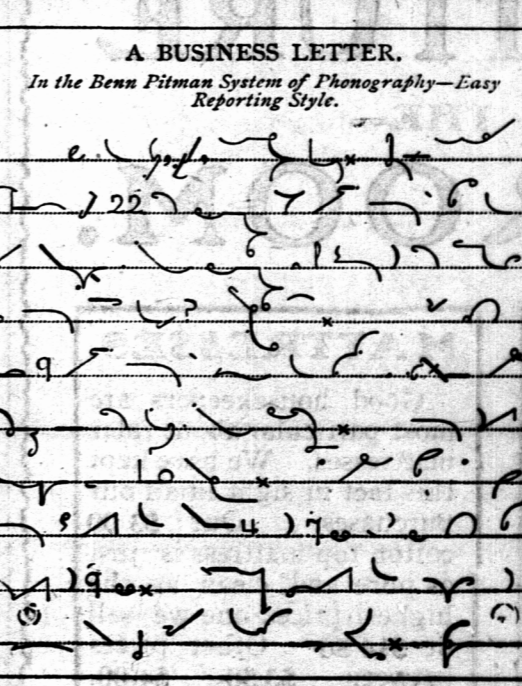
