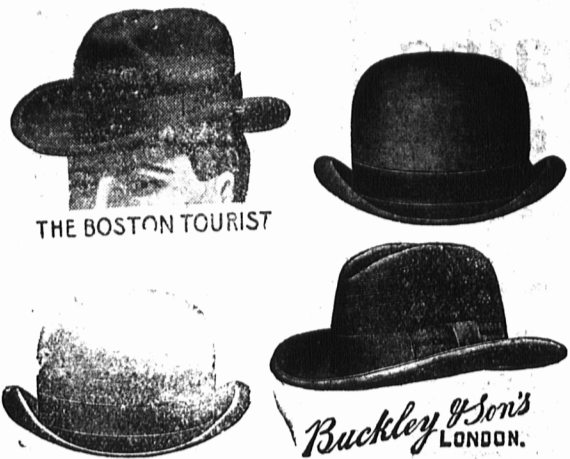

OVERFLOW QUEENS COUNTY

THERE will be found on The Guardian's music page today, a selection worthy of attention, entitled "Your Dad gave his life for his Country."

THE death took place at Glen Martin, March 4, of Margaret, relict of the late John McLeod, aged 78 years. She leaves to mourn four sons and four daughters.

His numerous friends in the Province will regret to learn that the Rev. Father Ryan, of M. Ryan, now a professor in St. Paul's University met with an accident which has laid him up in the hospital in that city for some weeks. A fracture of the ligament of the knee cap is the result of the effort he made to recover his equilibrium on an icy sidewalk. His prognosis favorably, all will be glad to hear.

With regard to the present outbreak of disease it may be interesting to recall the epidemic of smallpox of a much more serious kind which devastated Charlottetown in 1855. On the 18th of November in that year a case of violent smallpox was discovered in a house in Chesnut Street and on the following day the patient died. The disease spread rapidly in the vicinity of the house where the first case occurred. All precautions were immediately taken to confine the disease but the Board of Health worked at a disadvantage. Vaccination had been for years overlooked and there was no smallpox hospital available. Notwithstanding these drawbacks the epidemic was prevented from assuming such dimensions as to pass beyond control, and with the general adoption of vaccination its ravages were finally overcome. But while in the fatal days were many. There were fifty-two deaths registered by the end of December, as in a period of six weeks. By that time however the worst was over and the public had recovered in a great degree from the panic which at first was felt. It was stated at the close of the legislation by one of the Charlottetown newspapers that "our experience has taught us a bitter lesson. Vaccination is a certain preventative of the disease and the almost universal resort to it saved our City from the protracted serious consequences that attended its outbreak in other cities."
