The Supreme Court at Georgetown concluded its work and has adjourned sine die. In his address to the Grand Jury yesterday the judge referred to the case against the boy Murray, charged with stealing a spark coil from a gasoline launch at Montague. He also spoke of the improved methods in potato culture, and to the work which is being done in that line by Dr. Andrew MacPhail at Orwell. The value of good roads to this Province was also emphasized by His Lordship. The case against Murray, who pleaded "guilty," the judge gave him a reprimand, and salutary advice, before sentencing him to jail for one hour. Judgments were given in a number of actions for debt, but the whole docket was comparatively small. Court met Tuesday morning and adjourned that evening.

The body of the late Joseph Basha, city, was brought to this city yesterday from New Glasgow, via the Earl Grey, and arrived in this city on the special train. The remains were accompanied by the deceased's father and five of his friends and was met at the station here by a large number of relatives and acquaintances, many of whom could not control their feelings of sorrow over the death of the deceased under such circumstances. The deceased intended to visit home here in the very near future. Further particulars to hand state that in company with another man he was walking across a railway bridge near the Allan Shaft between New Glasgow and Stellarton when the train passed, both taking different sides. When the train went by Basha was missed. A trail of blood along the bridge told the terrible story. His body had been caught in the wheels and carried along some distance, being frightfully mangled when found. This bridge has been the silent witness of a number of tragedies in the past; some by drowning in the river underneath and some by accidents such as this on the line.
