An adjourned meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last evening with the full Board present.

A motion was passed to rescind a motion previously passed exempting Robinson's mills from taxation.

It was moved by Councillor Morrison, seconded by Councillor Reid: That in furtherance of the expressed opinion of the rate payers of the town a system of water-works and sewerage be constructed and maintained by the town.

Resolved that the Mayor be empowered to employ counsel to prepare the necessary legislation to carry said undertaking into effect by means of three commissioners possessed of the qualifications required of Councillors and to be elected by the property holders of the town and to hold office for the term of three years, the Commissioners at the end of the first and second years to draw lots as to who shall retire. The expense of the construction of said water-works and sewerage system to be provided for by the issue of debentures to be liquidated by a sinking fund, and such legislation to be approved by the Council.

The Town Clerk intimated that he had received letters from Mr. Brace and Mr. Fanning refusing the offer made them by the town for their property necessary in opening the new street to Water Street.

Neil McLeod addressed the Council in behalf of C. G. Gardiner who refuses to sell any part of his lot, but proposes that the town lease the whole lot at \$200 per year for 25 years, at the end of such period the town to receive a free deed of the property.

A resolution was passed asking the Dominion Government to assist in the expense of opening street in consideration that the street is necessary in order to get proper access to the post office from the business part of the town.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society were granted the free use of Market Hall on the 17th of February for an entertainment for the benefit of the poor.

Council adjourned.

The Treasurer was authorized to pay the amount of money on hand to reduce the mortgage on property. Meeting adjourned until next Monday evening.
