THE BRITISH CENSUS.

This is a census year mainly throughout the British Empire, and although not all the figures are yet available, so large a part of the King's dominions have been already reported upon as to give a fairly accurate forecast of the total. We have the figures for the United Kingdom, Australia and India, and it is to be observed as a rather striking fact that four out of five of King Edward's subjects are natives of India. The population of India, excepting Burma, has made slow progress during the past decade, owing to the successive famines. Burma, on the contrary, has increased 33 per cent since 1891.

The population of the Empire is distributed in the four quarters of the world approximately as follows:

Table with 2 columns: Region and Population. United Kingdom and Europe 44,000,000; Asia including India 300,014,000; Africa 31,103,000; America, Australasia 7,508,000; Total 388,300,000.

This above total of 388 millions is approximately the number of the King's subjects at the commencement of his reign. At the same time Egypt and the Sudan, nominally subjects of the Sultan of Turkey, are under British occupation and practically under British administration. The populations there if they were counted it would make the ground total up to 400 millions.

The entire population of the earth was estimated in 1891 by the Royal Geographical Society to be 1,487,900,000. Making a liberal allowance for the increase during ten years past the world's population would not yet be equal to four times that of the British Empire. It is therefore quite within the bounds of probability and may even be stated with confidence as a fact that King Edward is today the lawful Sovereign of more than one fourth of the people in the earth.

Put in concise form and round figures the following is the colonial and home population of the great powers of the world:

Table with 3 columns: Country, Colonial, Home, Total. U. K. 347,000,000; France 58,000,000; Germany 15,000,000; Russia 3,000,000; Austria 2,000,000; U. S. 10,000,000.

If we add together the total home and colonial population of Russia, Germany, the United States and France we shall have but 385 millions against the 388 millions of the British Empire.

THE PREMIER'S CANDIDATURE.

We print with pleasure the Premier's letter in which he states that nothing but the will of the people will prevent him being a candidate for West Queens at the coming by-election. We have no disposition to throw any doubt upon the sincerity of this statement. After a quarter of a century in political life without a single defeat at the polls, and having attained the Premiership of this Province, Mr. Farquharson has undoubtedly very strong claims upon his party. He might claim the best thing in their gift and the party leaders would be justified, as parties go, in giving it to him.

But the will of the people is not always very clearly expressed in the signatures to a requisition. Where a considerable number of strong party men decline to sign a requisition there is always a reason for such action. In this case a number declined to sign from a reason neither flattering nor unfriendly to Mr. Farquharson. They desire that his services may be retained for a few years more in the Premiership, where they are greatly needed, and that in due time he may be installed at Government House. They would promote Mr. Farquharson, but not in the precise way in which he now, somewhat hastily, seeks promotion. We do not think from what we can learn
