News Budget of Happenings Round About the District.

BISHOP McDONALD, of Charlottetown, was in Pictou last week, the guest of Father Chisholm.

REV. A. W. K. HERDMAN, of Georgetown, was in Pictou last week, the guest of Mrs W. H. Herdman.

THE laws and privileges committee of the city council came to a decision last night respecting the licensing of the trading stamp business. The committee was unanimous in recommending that the recorder be instructed to prepare an ordinance, fixing the license at \$600. This action is taken under authority of legislation passed last session of the legislature.—Halifax Herald.

MESSRS. J. W. CALLBECK, Augustine Cove, and F. G. Boyer, Georgetown, were in the city Saturday. These gentlemen and Mr. E. R. Brow, were appointed by the Live Stock Exhibitors at Halifax and St. John, to wait on the Provincial Government in connection with Live Stock interests, and it is understood they succeeded with their mission.

CAPT. McDONALD of Summerside, P. E. I., commanding the schooner Rose Mary, arrived in port on Friday last from Labrador. The Rose Mary had been chartered by a Newfoundland exploring company, for the purpose of searching for gold and other minerals in Labrador. They had been several months prospecting, and have been fairly successful, finding good deposits of gold, copper and iron. They were within 130 miles of Hudson Bay, and will next year return to the scene of their discovery with machinery and proceed to develop these minerals. The company have a capital of over \$10,000.—North Sydney Herald.

A SERIOUS CHARGE

Have the Ballot Boxes Been Tampered With?

The 'Minerve' publishes the following serious statement: 'Well informed persons have come to our office to tell us that in a large number of counties a manipulation of the ballots was being prepared which would be a repetition, on a large scale, of the notorious St Ann's trap. We are not in a position to confirm that information, but the first results given by the telegraph differ in such an enormous measure from the results just published that we would in no way be surprised at the correctness of the strange information which was received. The returning officers are, as a general rule, Rougees of the most fanatical kind in the world, and the deputy returning officers are of the same sort. In order not to embarrass the Rouge policy, or rather to disembarass it from a vexing question, which will probably be ruinous for the party, what would those mere tools of Rougeism not do? In ordinary elections, when they are watched by the opposite party like mice by cats, our Liberal officers have rendered themselves guilty of all sorts of infamies. Why, in a calculation or a recount the result of which in no way troubles our friends the Conservatives, why should not these unscrupulous persons manipulate the votes in their own way? Why should they not sufficiently stuff the ballots to annul the Ontario vote, for example, and thus put an end, by such a stroke of genius and audacity, to the prohibitionists, their dear friends, who contributed so largely to give them power? We advise our friends to watch the p'ebiscite officers. In casting our eyes on certain corrected reports published by the 'S. J.' we have reason to believe that they are false; there are more votes shown against prohibition than the total number of those that were cast in all.'

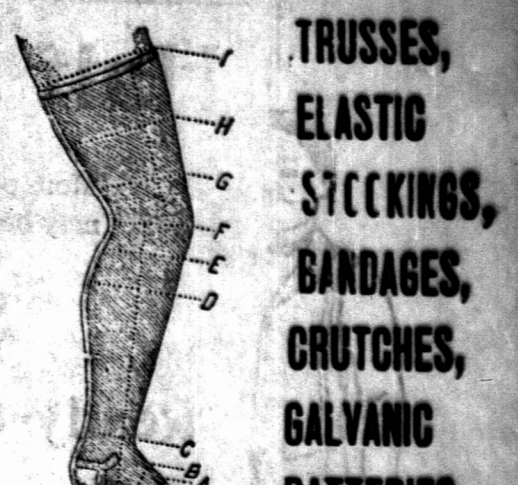
