PROPOSED PROHIBITION AMENDMENTS.

An important public meeting of the Provincial Temperance Alliance was held on Friday afternoon to consider and devise measures for rendering the Prohibitory Law more effective...

The first of these resolutions proposes to take away from the druggists the right to sell, or to keep in stock any intoxicating liquors other than pure alcohol...

In regard to this resolution it is to be observed that there has been very great abuse of the privilege of druggists by certain of their number, so much so that some respectable persons engaged in the drug business are not only willing but desirous that the amendment now proposed shall become law...

It is felt that the proposed amendment in that regard, if enacted into law would tend to re-establish an honorable calling in its true position and take away the reproach that has been sometimes cast upon them...

Furthermore, inasmuch as a number of druggist firms have become incorporated as companies, and as others may do so, and as a corporation can be punished only by fine and not by imprisonment for violation of the Prohibitory Law...

The second resolution deals with clubs and associations which import or keep in stock intoxicating liquors for sale or distribution among their members. It is quite clear that when the Prohibitory Act was passed it was not intended that such keeping in stock and such distribution of liquors in social clubs should be permitted...

It is now proposed to render such joint possession and such distribution of liquors in clubs and associations equally unlawful and punishable by the same penalties as unlawful sale or keeping for sale. Undoubtedly the amendment in this regard expresses the opinion of the great majority of the temperance people of the Province...

is any more necessary than like power for an hotel proprietor to do the same.

There are clubs and clubs. In the best social clubs, and we believe the same to be true of the Charlottetown Club, only a portion of the membership partake of intoxicants in the club rooms, while intoxication on the club premises may involve expulsion. Intoxicating liquors are by no means necessary for the social enjoyment of the members...

The proposal that any one member of a liquor-dispensing club shall be held liable to the personal and monetary penalties of a violation of the Prohibitory Law may seem a rather drastic one, at the first blush. But how else can the extreme penalty be applied to a corporation...

The Guardian was unable to lend its support to all the provisions of the proposed Prohibition Act 1911 as recently put forward by the Alliance and rejected by Premier Hazard. The amendments to the Prohibition Act 1900 as now above outlined, and excepting as above excepted, would, we believe, strengthen the law and make it more effective without entailing any of the dangers which in our judgment would have followed the enactment of the bill submitted to the Government a few days ago...

LEGISLATORS FOR LIFE.

There is a good deal of variety in the constitutions of Upper Houses in the Parliaments of the United Kingdom and the over-sea Dominions and Provinces. In the United Kingdom the House of Lords is made up mainly of Peers appointed for life...

Canada has a Senate of 87 whose members are appointed for life. Only two of the Canadian Provinces have Upper Houses. These are the Legislative Councils of Quebec, 24 members, and of Nova Scotia, 21 members, who hold life appointments.

In the Australian Commonwealth there is a Senate of 36 members, elected for six years. All of the six States composing the Commonwealth have Upper Houses also. In New South Wales a House of 53 and in Queensland a House of 41 are appointed by the Crown for life.

New Zealand has an Upper House of 40 elected for seven years. In the South African Union there is an Upper House of 40 mostly elected for 10 years. Thus the majority of the Upper Chambers in the British Empire are elective, as was shown by a return recently laid before the Imperial Parliament.

And now there is a prospect of ex-President Roosevelt's conduct in the Panama affair being investigated by the Committee on Foreign Relations. His recent boast that he "took" the Panama Canal Zone from the Republic of Columbia forms the basis of a resolution introduced in the House of Representatives ordering the Foreign Relations Committee to inquire into the matter and report. It is believed the Democratic majority in the House will pass the resolution.

What is called the Kangaroo Closure is the new method of dealing with obstructive measures adopted in the British Parliament. It gives the presiding officer power to "jump over" in kangaroo fashion any number of motions on the order paper and take up a later one. One cable despatch states that the Opposition had prepared a thousand amendments to the veto bill with a view to prolonging the discussion thereon indefinitely. The kangaroo method is defended on the ground of necessity, as desperate obstruction requires a desperate remedy. There is occasionally some talk of adopting a milder form of closure in the Ottawa Parliament.

The rather important statement was made by Hon. Mr. Fielding in the House of Commons the other day that it is not the intention of the Government to increase the British preference to 50 per cent nor to remove the duty from agricultural implements. He intimated that when the trade agreement is adopted it may become necessary to make some minor tariff changes to be in harmony with the preference principle, but such changes would not be important.

A charter has been granted a company with a capital of \$10,000,000 for a shipbuilding plant on Sydney harbor. Sir Henry Pellett, of Toronto, Governor J. M. Gibson; Charles Ellis, of Clyde Bank, Scotland; Alex. Gracie, of Fairfield Ship Company, and A. C. Ross, of Sydney, are the incorporators. The company will carry on business under the name of the British Canadian Shipbuilding and Dock Company. Mayor Gunn says there is not the slightest doubt of their starting work there in a short time.
