## THE COOK'S CORNER

### CHICKEN PARISIENNE

Two cups coarsely chopped, cooked chicken, 1 cup sliced cooked mushrooms, 3 cups hot chicken stock (or 2 bouillon cubes dissolved in hot water), 14 soda wafers, rolled fine, 1 teaspoon minced onion, 1 egg yolk, beaten, 1-2 cup cream, 1 tablespoon shredded pimiento.

Put chicken and mushrooms in saucepan. Pour stock over crackers, add onion and beat until smooth. Pour over chicken and mushrooms and cook over low flame for ten minutes. Combine beaten egg yolk and cream and stir into chicken mixture. Add pimiento, heat, remove from fire and serve. Six portions.

### SOUR CREAM DATE CAKE

1 cup brown sugar  
1 cup thick sour cream  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1-2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon soda  
1-4 teaspoon cream of tartar  
1-2 teaspoon salt  
1-2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1-2 cup chopped nuts  
1-2 cup chopped dates

Method—One of the nicest things about making a cake with sour cream is that it is so simple to mix, as there is very rarely any butter or shortening that has to be creamed.

Combine all the dry ingredients except the sugar, and sift together once. Add the sugar to the sour cream and blend, then stir in the slightly beaten egg.

Mix the nuts and dates into the sifted dry ingredients and gradually add to the cream-sugar mixture, stirring after each addition just until well-blended. Pour the mixture into a square pan that has been greased or lined with wax paper and bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 45 minutes. This recipe is just right for a 8 by 8 by 2-inch pan.

Apple peel rubbed on verdigris stains on brass or copper will remove them; the article should then be rubbed with a clean duster.

A flannel dipped in olive oil and rubbed well over sweater articles (afterwards cleaning with a soft duster) will give a lustrous polish. The yolk of an egg, when the white only has been used, will keep for several days if beaten up with water.
