

IMPORTANT READING MATTER SELECTED FROM THIS WEEK'S NEWS FOR THE GUARDIAN'S DAY SUBSCRIBERS

(Canadian Press.) BOSTON, Jan. 25—The long fight to save Silas Phelps, who murdered Deputy Sheriff Haakins, failed today when the executive council refused to commute the death sentence. He will probably be executed early tomorrow.

(Canadian Press.) ZANTEGGERO, Jan. 25—A violent earthquake caused a great amount of damage in the Ionian Islands today. The shocks were felt here as well as on the Islands of Leukas and Cephalonia, where much property was destroyed. No fatalities are yet reported.

(Canadian Press.) LONDON, Jan. 25—A Home Rule meeting will be held in Ulster Hall, Belfast, on Feb. 8th as arranged, and Winston Spencer Churchill, First Lord of the Admiralty and John E. Redmond, Irish Nationalist leader will speak, if the determination reached yesterday is carried into effect.

A conference of the chief Government whips in office was attended by Churchill, Lord Pirrie of the city of Belfast and Sir Rufus Isaacs, Attorney General, the last named to give legal advice.

The final decision taken was to hold the Belfast meeting if Mr. Redmond is sufficiently recovered from his recent illness.

BELFAST, Jan. 25—The Liberal association applied to the corporation of the city for the use of Ulster Hall on the morning of Feb. 8, the day when the Home Rule demonstration will take place.

The object is to enable the Nationalists to take steps to clear the hall should the Unionists attempt to retain possession.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 23—The Orangemen of the city sent a communication to the board of control yesterday demanding an investigation of the charge against the St. Boniface Hospital, that the hospital refused to permit Mrs. Laura Brewer to visit her husband, at present in that institution, because being a Catholic they had not been married by the Catholic church.

This charge has been denied by the hospital. Thursday was the day set by the civic board to meet the Orangemen's delegates. The city contributes to the support of the hospital. The Brewer case has been made much of as an instance of the Ne Temere decree in Canada.

LONDON, Jan. 23—Sir Herbert Tree made his debut in vaudeville at the Palace Theatre last night, in an adaptation of Rudyard Kipling's "The Man Who Was." The occasion was marked by tremendous enthusiasm. In a speech, Sir Herbert said he was glad to be one of the first to "break bread" in variety under the new conditions, and he was sure the new regime would be of great value to actors.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Jan. 26—A campaign against the white plague is to be inaugurated in Newfoundland under the direction of the Government.

William Reid, President of the Reid Newfoundland Company has offered to erect and equip a sanatorium for the treatment of tuberculous patients in this city at a cost of \$50,000 and his two brothers, Henry and Robert Reid, agree to spend a like sum or sixteen cottage hospitals to be scattered over the outlying districts. The government has accepted the offer.

HALIFAX, Jan. 28—The Government steamer Lady Laurier, located at Perry Point, was reported this afternoon to have "sailed somewhat," and the marine department officials say they would not be surprised if tonight at high tide the steamer's stern were covered by water.

A despatch tonight states that the rescue steamer Montagu is alongside and the ten-inch pump which struck down had started working. Captain Travis will report the result in the morning. The government steamer Aberdeen sailed tonight for Perry Point with a fourteen-inch pump, an additional ten-inch pump and two divers.

C. H. Harvey, agent of the marine department, expresses confidence that the Lady Laurier will be located and brought to Halifax.

CAMPBELLTON, Jan. 25—Yesterday, while the men were at dinner, Richards' Mill, on the I. C. R., about fifty miles from here, blew up. The terrific impact of the explosion could be heard miles. Debris flew in all directions. A huge steel rail which lay near the boiler was launched bodily through the air and rammed through a house near by. Three men, who were in the mill, narrowly escaped with their lives. One had his overalls blown clear off. Had the crew been in the mill at the time a terrible calamity might have resulted.
