Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a certain section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Under six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a tract of at least 80 acres owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section a quarter-section homestead. Price \$100 per acre. Duties: Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate five years extra).

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.
