Importers Sale Tax Reduced

MONTREAL, June 21.—Word was received Saturday by the secretary of the Canadian Manufacturers Association that goods imported for use in manufacture in Canada would not be subject to the double sales tax amounting to two per cent. but only to the importers sale tax of one per cent. The information comes direct from George S. Taylor, Deputy Minister of Inland Revenue. This ruling has particular importance for Canadian Railways Steamship Companies and Utilities Companies which import enormous quantities of materials.

Report Issued of Soldiers S. Board

OTTAWA, June 21.—Dealing with the work accomplished by the Soldier Settlement Bureau since its inception, the special committee on re-establishment says in its report that over 50,000 applications from members of the C. E. F. have been received by the Soldier Settlement Board nearly 3,700 have been accepted and 42 per cent. of these are actually on the land, while 6,500 additional have settled upon soldier grants of free Dominion lands. These operations entail commitments of close to \$60,000,000 of which approximately \$42,000,000 has been disbursed.

the laundry bag was then dealt with by counsel. In the first place if the prisoner had committed the crime he would most certainly not have left them there. The jury might proceed on that basis. Mr. Saunders, however, maintained that all the evidence including the continued use of a hot water bottle indicated a miscarriage. The blood was found on the garment and most certainly came from the inside.

Mr. Saunders strongly attacked Dr. McTaggart. He claimed that he came down here and instead of giving his evidence in a manly and dignified manner he went out of his way to play the spy in the Ellis home and after his testimony remained in court sitting by the Attorney-General prompting him and endeavoring to intimidate all the other doctors.

According to Dr. McPhee it was impossible for any human being to have known all about it. In the position. TORONTO, June 21.—Over 10,000 Roman Catholic men and boys took part in the fifth annual rally and parade of the Holy Name Society yesterday afternoon making the largest rally the society has ever had. Assembling at the House of Providence on Power Street and the surrounding streets at 2.30 the huge procession started promptly at 3 p.m., passing along Queen to University Avenue, thence to the spacious grounds at St. Josephs on St. Alban's street where the service was held. Over 60 churches were represented in the marching including representatives from Port Credit, Pickering, Richmond Hill, Thornhill and New Market. The weather was ideal for the parade and thousands of spectators lined the route of march from Queen Street to St. Alban's the Catholic heart is loyal to God and to the constitution of the country, said Rev. Dr. K. P. Treacy, in addressing the multitude, in the St. Alban's grounds we have been taught from the cradle he said in the language of St. Paul, let every man be subject unto the higher powers, the powers that be are ordained of God.

Momentous Doings Expected at Caucus

(Special to The Guardian.) OTTAWA, June 21.—Momentous happenings are expected at the Unionist caucus for political organization to be held shortly. There is a general impression among the members of Parliament that the caucus is to be held Tuesday but Sir Robert Borden returns on that date and as your correspondent cannot find any member who has yet received formal notice of a caucus on that day, it seems more likely that it will be held on Thursday next. The Premier is away, making up his mind as to his course when confronting the caucus. When he left Ottawa Saturday he informed a friend that the matter was still uncertain and that he had returned to Ottawa sooner than he intended and that he had not been long enough back at work to decide whether his constitution would stand the permanent strain or not. His difficulties at the caucus are reported to be enhanced because Hon. C. C. Hallantyne is said to have threatened resignation, if his naval bill is not pushed through. The government is nervous about this issue as many Unionist members are really against spending money now for a navy.

Several hundred extra police reserves were patrolling the black belt today, following the outbreaks.
