**THE GOVERNMENT AND PROTECTION.**

It would be a work of supererogation to show that before coming into power the Liberal party of the Dominion were committed to a large reduction of both the revenue and expenditure of the country; that they were especially hostile to the duties on breadstuffs, coal and coal oil, and that they were pledged to eliminate the element of protection from the tariff. It is equally clear that both the revenue and expenditure of the country are larger than ever they were before, that the duties on food-stuffs, coal and coal oil are still in existence and that the general tariff is still very highly protective.

The taxes on sugar were increased by the Laurier Government to the extent of a quarter of a million by Mr. Fielding's admission, and in the year 1900 amounted to \$2,586,123. In taxes on breadstuffs the Government took out of the pockets of the people last year \$971,000 and in taxes on coal \$1,309,000. The exorbitant taxes on coal oil which were a staple ground of complaint when the Liberals were in opposition, have been but little reduced. Without going further it is to be observed that these taxes have been maintained, in some cases diminished a little and in other cases increased—without any pretext of necessity, for the national treasury has overflowed for years past and the party in power have been able to boast of a succession of the largest surpluses in the history of the country.

These are certainly strange, unexpected and anomalous conditions. He who would have predicted in 1893 that the Liberal party in power would so far continue the protective policy of their predecessors, would have been thought insane. But still having done the things they have done, it has been exceedingly difficult for the Opposition to successfully attack them. We had at the general election of November last plentiful charges that the Liberals had broken their pledges in regard to protection, but at the same time the persons making the charges were compelled to admit that the retention of protection was a good thing and not a bad thing. In other words that the Liberal policy while in opposition was wrong but their tariff policy in power was in the main right.

It has been many times charged, and not without a show of reason, that the Laurier Government have stolen the policy of their predecessors, modified it by the British preference and some minor changes otherwise, but retained its essential feature of protection. But it is to be observed that the country has endorsed them in this course. That is a vital and all important condition, for under our

free institutions we must have a public policy which accords with the popular will. If the present Government have cast away their revenue tariff duties, and the principles of economy which they formerly professed and have become protective in their policy and in their expenditure, still the economists have said, "We prefer that the men shall bear rule in Canada." The people determined to change their rulers whether with or without a change of fiscal policy.

The Winnipeg Free Press on the 20th charged that Premier Roblin and two of his colleagues when visiting St. Paul on public business had registered there under assumed names. The Press claimed that this action was an "insult to the people of Manitoba." The charge was met by a denial in the newspapers supporting the Government, and by a partial denial in the Winnipeg Free Press on the part of Mr. Roblin. The Free Press resorts by publishing a photographic facsimile of a page of the *Minneapolis Register*, St. Paul on the date when the Ministers were there, and affixing to the names R. P. Lee and M. R. O'Rourke, on the register of the Hotel are the names signed by Hon. R. P. Roblin and Hon. Robert Rogers respectively. It remains to be seen what will follow this exposure.
