—TWO FRENCH DEPUTIES ACCUSED IN CHAMBER. PARIS, Dec. 17.—Paul Deschanel, President of the Chamber of Deputies, announced in the Chamber today that he had received two requests for authorization of proceedings against Deputies. The demands were made by General Dubail, the Military Governor of Paris, against Joseph Caillaux, who was recently accused by Gustave Lerve of being the centre of the campaign for a ruinous and dishonorable peace, and Louis Laustolat, Deputy from Landes.

—GERMAN SPIES IN HONOLULU. HONOLULU, Dec. 17.—While the ship's band was playing lively tunes to drown out all tell-tale sounds of the wireless apparatus of the German cruiser Gier when she was interned in this harbor, relayed messages between German agents in the United States and Japan in furtherance of a plot to embroil the two countries in war, according to an article printed in the Star Bulletin here.

—ON the authority of the United States Intelligence Bureau, it declares that the seal placed on the Gier wireless by the American Government was broken by the Germans so that the messages might be transmitted.

—PREMIER Clemenceau, who holds the portfolio of Minister of War, transmitted the letters as head of the administration of military justice, to M. Deschanel, General Dubail demanded suspension of the parliamentary immunity of M. M. Caillaux and Laustolat in order that they might be prosecuted under the rules of military justice.

—AS regards M. Caillaux, the Temps says the articles of the Penal Code concerning attempts on the safety of the State are invoked.
