That appointment, according to the evidence, was made on February 19, 1923. What happens next? We have a telegram coming down from Mr. Sinclair to Premier Bell saying that they desired that Mitchell should be appointed as representative for colonization purposes by this Government and that the Dominion Government was paying his expenses up to the amount of \$150.

Some telegrams passed to and fro at that time, and at last Premier Bell sent an appointment to Mitchell as representative for colonization purposes for this Province.

I believe that a mistake was made at that time in making that appointment. They should have held to their original intention of putting in an appointment to Mitchell as representative for colonization purposes for this Province.

Whoever nominated Mitchell to represent the Government ought to make good to those officers the money they lost. That is the opinion of Hon. Mr. Larkin, the high Commissioner for Canada, appointed by the Dominion Government.

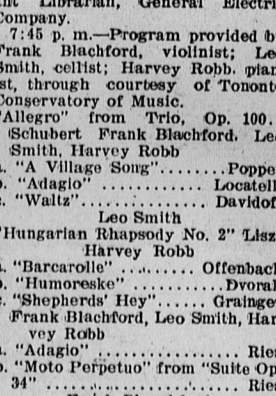

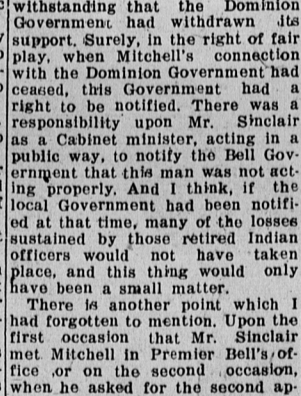

that point, they unquestionably have a claim on moral grounds. I do not think that we should at all detract from the fact that the local Government of that time was a great deal to blame for their carelessness and indifference in the matter. The idea of taking a man from a central province of India, absolutely unknown to this Province and this Province unknown to him, and sending him across to the British Isles in order to secure immigrants for this country! It was a ridiculous proposition in the first place for any Government ever to consider. It showed that there was some influence other than imaginary interests behind the movement, that we do not know and probably will never know. There is something suspicious about it, for otherwise I do not think that the leader of the Government at that time, Mr. Bell would have changed his opinion so quickly, between the latter part of January, when Mitchell first serviced him accompanied by Mr. Sinclair, and when they gave him his appointment on February 19th. We cannot tell, we have no evidence to show, what influence was brought to bear during those days to secure the appointment of Mitchell, and to appoint him too, in the words and directions of the Hon. Mr. Sinclair.

It is necessary that something should be done for these men, it is absolutely necessary, not only on their own account but in order to place this Province in a position that it should be. Something has got to be done, and who is going to pay the bill? I think, after listening to the speech of my hon. friend, there can be no doubt at all that the Dominion Government is liable, and it is up to this House to press the matter home to the Dominion Government and to leave no stone unturned until this is brought about.
