

The Tredway Family

A history of the Tredway family has just been published by William Thomas Tredway, a lawyer practicing at Pittsburgh, Pa. It contains 500 pages, is printed on splendid paper and contains 35 illustrations of members of the family in different generations. The Coat of Arms of the Tredway family with a spear through a Turk's head would indicate that the Coat of Arms dates back to the time of the Crusaders. Thomas Tredway, during the reign of Henry VI, in 1432-1464, seems to have established the family. The genealogy carries the family back 600 years, and cites Henry Tredway, as the father of Richard Tredway, one of the Benchers of the Inner Temple in London.

The earliest known ancestor in America was Nathaniel, who settled at Watertown, Mass., in 1635, and Josiah Tredway, who married Eunice Foote, was the ancestor of eight Tredways, who were soldiers in the Revolutionary War.

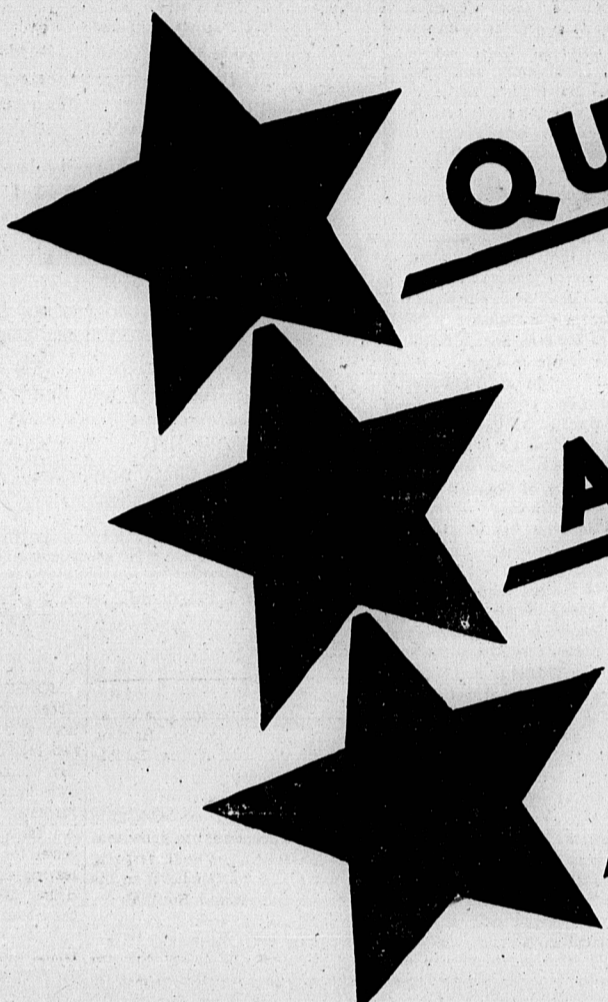
Another early ancestor in America was Crispin Tredway, whose father, John Tredway, left England in 1700, and died on the voyage over and was buried at sea, Crispin Tredway, settling and starting a tobacco plantation in Harford County, near Baltimore, Md.

From these earliest known ancestors have sprung Francis Wilcox Tredway, Lieutenant Governor of Ohio, and his brother, Lyman Tredway, Vice President and Director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, Ohio; Judge William M. Tredway, of Va., Tilen Towrer Tredway, Congressman from Massachusetts; Oswald Garland Tredway, a prominent lawyer of Chatham, Va.; William Eugene Tredway, a lawyer at Spencer, Indiana; Ralph E. Tredway, a prominent lawyer at Glen Elyn, Illinois, and many others. Among the notables, with whom the family was by marriage or otherwise connected, was Queen Victoria, John Adams, grandfather, and John Quincy Adams, uncle of Mrs. William Tredway, twice an inmate of the White House. The family has produced soldiers who participated in every war in which the United States has been engaged from the Revolutionary War, down to and through the World War, including General William Wyse Tredway, who was born in Connecticut, was married in New York State, and enlisted in the Civil War, from the University of Wisconsin. He was a descendant of Nathaniel Tredway, of Watertown, Mass.

Among the other interesting characters contained in the genealogy is the Rev. Silas B. Tredway, of Baltimore, Md.; also Col. Robert Rose Tredway, of Atlanta, Ga., now at Ft. Leavenworth, Kan.; Stutley Weeks Tredway, Broadmoor Farms, Salisbury, Conn.; Howard Platt Tredway, of Strawbridge & Tredway, Lancaster, Pa.; Lauris Goldsmith Tredway, Managing Director of the "Real New England Inns," scattered over Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Vermont, of Williams Inn, Williamstown, Mass.; Cornea D. Tredway, of Kenosha, Wis.; George C. Tredway, of Peoria, Ill.; Ralph Crispin Tredway, Manager of the National Surety Co., Columbus, Ohio, and John Dwight Tredway, of Seattle, Washington.

The family seems to have been intermarried with the family of Prescott, the historian; that of Miles Standish; Tom Sawyer; the Parkes, Abells, Adams, Anderson, Arnold, Ball, Barker, Barrett, Bassett, Bassett, Bishop, Blissell, Bond, Bottrill, Bowman, Brown, Bull, Butler, Caldwell, Calhoun, Campbell, Carroll, Cathart, Chalfonte, Chapman, Clark, Coleman, Davis, Draper, Duncan, Dunn, Elder, Foote, Gaines, Gilber, Gillett, Greer, Hapgood, Harris, Herndon, High, Howe, Hyde, Johnson, Jones, Lawton, Lightfoot, Magness, Marshall, Meredith, Miller, Moore, McKean, Norris, Orr, Parmalee, Peel, Peetee, Quay, Ransom, Roberts, Russell, Sawyer, Severens, Sill, Skinner, Sharples, Smith, Thompson, Tiffany, Underwood, Vint, Welling, White, Williams, Wilson, Worthington, Young, and others too numerous to mention here, and was connected by marriage with many prominent families in official and other high stations in almost every state in the Union.

### COURT TO ASSESS REPAIRS TO BODY

**SYDNEY, Australia, Sept. 2** — While John Hegarty was at work in an underground railway shaft in Sydney a few weeks ago a stone fell from the roof onto his head. John's false teeth fell out and were broken.

Appearing before the Workers Compensation Commission, Hegarty claimed the cost of repairs to the false teeth.

The railway commissioners resisted the claim on the ground that false teeth are not "living members of the body on behalf

of which the law provides compensation.

"If a man broke his wooden leg, his employer would have to replace it", said Judge Perdrau.

The ruling was that Hegarty was entitled to the cost of repairs to his false teeth as well as to his head.

### DIVERS WILL HUNT FOR \$5,000,000

**LONDON, Sept. 2** — An attempt to recover from the bottom of the sea \$5,000,000 in gold, the balance of the \$30,000,000 which went down in the White Star liner Laurentic when she was sunk by a submarine during the war, will be made by the Molet Salvage Syndicate of London.

The wreck lies about 20 fathoms deep off the Irish coast. The earlier salvage work that was done by the Admiralty was undertaken under great difficulties on account of the frequency of rough weather,

The work was abandoned after the recovery of the greater part of the gold.

The Admiralty has granted the salvage syndicate a concession to work on the wreck for a specific period.

### SCIENTIST DISCOVERS CAUSE OF CANCER

**LONDON, Sept. 2** — A chemically pure substance of known structure that produces cancer in a very large and constant proportion of cases has been discovered at the London Cancer Hospital.

The discovery is considered a great advance towards medical knowledge of the causation of cancer.

The substance is that particular constituent of coal tar that produces cancer when coal tar is applied to the skin.

In repeated experiments, application of the substance has created cancer in 80 out of 100 mice.

### ANCIENT INDIAN CITY IS BEING EXCAVATED

**SWEETWATER, Neb., Sept. 2** — High on a bluff overlooking Beaver Creek, the forefathers of the Paw-

nee Indians of the Nebraska plains built a city.

The site of the ancient city of the plains west of here, was discovered this summer by archeologists seeking to trace the history of some of the plain's Indian tribes.

The old city, buried by a few feet of earth, is believed to have flourished 600 years ago.

Chipped flint bone instruments, bits of pottery, pretty beads and arrow heads have been taken from the ruins. From the specimens scientists are piecing together a story of the early Indian of the prairie.

Traces of a lost city were first found by the workman for the rail-

road, for a track was laid over a portion of the city.

**EL DORADO SPRINGS, Mo., Sept. 2** — An apple tree planted 65 years ago by the late Dr. W. E. Dawson is still bearing fruit.

### SLEEPING CAR TRAVEL UP

**STOCKHOLM, Sept. 2** — Sleeping car travel is growing in Sweden, reports Director General Axel Granholm of the state owned railroads, to the government. Last

year the average number of berths per night was 1,150, or a total of 415,562, as compared with 200,217 in 1913. The introduction of comfortable sleeping compartments in third class has been responsible for the greatest gain.
