**HOME NURSE**

Communicable diseases are likely to leave weakened hearts, ear infections, infected glands, diseased tonsils or other disorders, writes Mary Beard, director nursing service, American Red Cross. For this reason every child should be protected from exposure to such diseases if possible.

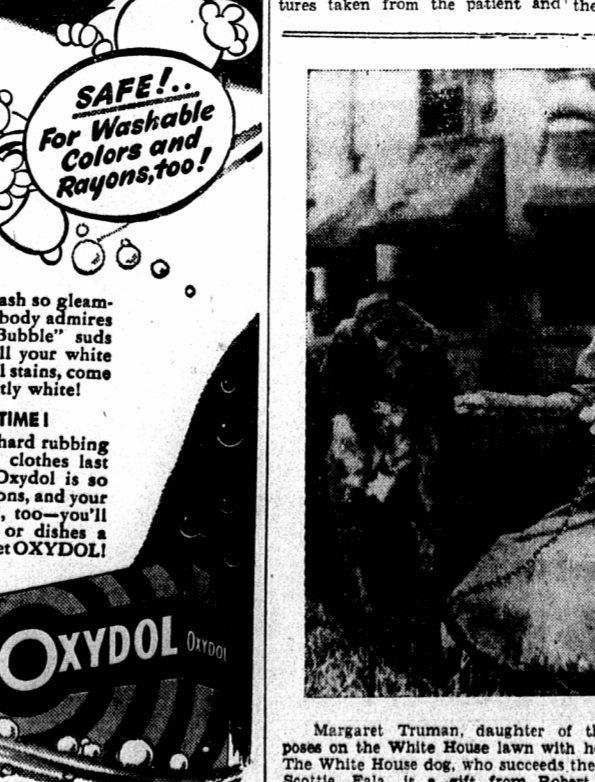
It used to be taken for granted that when one child in the family developed a communicable disease, all others who had not previously had it would soon catch it—to use the old-fashioned expression. Now we know that it is possible to isolate a patient in one room of the house and by using care keep some communicable diseases from spreading. Of course, if other children have been exposed before the nature of the disease was discovered, isolation of the patient will not keep them from getting sick.

Isolation limits the movements of a person who as a communicable disease so that he will not come in contact with other people. This means a room or at least a bed to himself and all articles needed for his care set apart for his use alone.

**Doctor Will Decide**

The period of isolation usually continues as long as there are body discharges that carry germs. This is determined in some cases by cultures taken from the patient and submitted to a laboratory for examination. In other cases isolation is continued until the doctor feels certain the release of the patient will not endanger others.

Quarantine differs from isolation. It limits the movement of those who have been exposed to the disease (and who have not previously had it) as well as the person who has it. There are not many diseases for which quarantine is required, but regulations for this vary in different communities. It is the responsibility of the home nurse to report to the local health department if communicable disease invades her home, and to get instructions from that source for the protection of the family and the community.



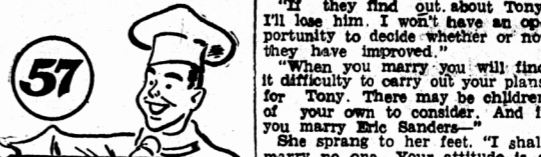
