The S. S. Harland has laid up this season. The East and West and Orwell rivers are not now navigable. The past season was a good one for the Harland; traffic was fairly heavy all summer and at times the freight taxed the capacity of the sea n.r.

The western train arrival in this city at nine fifty last evening being on time. The Murray Harbor train was an hour and thirty-five minutes late, the morning train from the east and the morning train from the west were each twenty-five minutes late. The evening train from the east was on time.

The attendance at the City Market was very good yesterday considering the coldness of the weather and the heavy roads. Pork was steady at six and three-quarter to seven cents a lb for heavy and seven and three-quarter cents a lb for light. Turkeys were very scarce at twenty cents a lb. Ducks and geese were not so plentiful as on last market day. They sold at fourteen and one half cents a lb. Chickens and fowls were up to their usual standard and brought in from ten to twelve cents a lb. Other prices were unchanged.

A very enjoyable evening was spent at the Morell Hotel, City, on Thursday last, when Mrs. H. Gregor Gould was waited upon by her former pupils, Ira and Herbert Stewart and Miss Maria Rapson. Herbert Stewart then presented Mrs. Gould with a silver card receiver. Mrs. Gould replied in a few well chosen remarks, expressing her appreciation of her former pupils' kindness.

A large crowd attended the Bijou Theatre last night and an excellent program was thoroughly appreciated. The film "Early settlers in Minnesota" was one of those pictures of early frontier life showing the attack on the settlers by the Indians while on the warpath. The trials of a village schoolmaster was excellently depicted in the picture entitled "School Examinations." The pictures "My friend the Doctor" and "A cold storage romance" brought forth rounds of applause.

The annual meeting of the Maple Leaf Farmers' Institute was held in Alberry Plains Schoolhouse on Thursday evening, Dec. 8th., the President J. F. Jenkins, in the chair. The secretary gave a brief summary of the business done through the institute since its reorganization and the auditors gave the financial statement showing a very satisfactory balance on hand. After the members expressed themselves fully satisfied with the work done, not forgetting to state their appreciation of Mr. Brodie's lecture at the time of its reorganization to whom a great deal of credit is due, the President, secretary and auditors were tendered a vote of thanks. After the election of directors for ensuing year besides, other business of importance had been transacted, the meeting closed. Mr. Brodie has agreed to lecture for institute on Monday evening, Dec. 19th. at seven o'clock, at which a full house is expected.

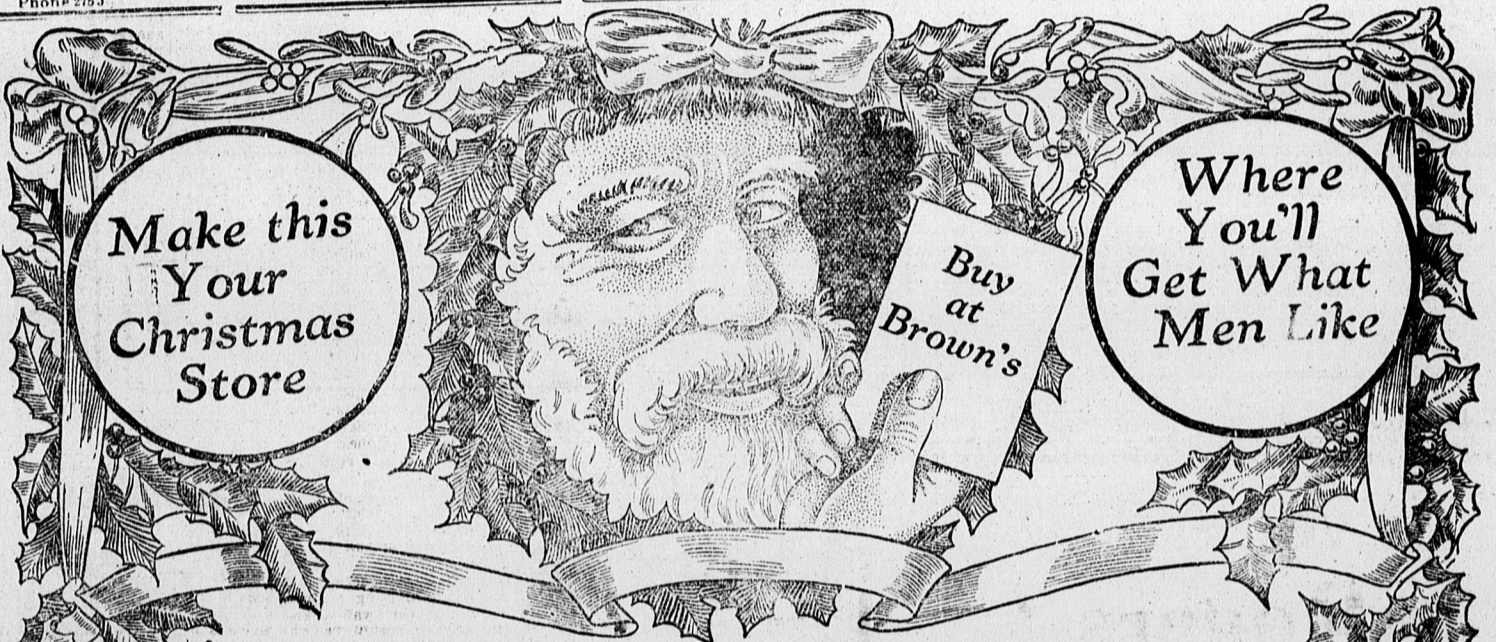
