**PORTUGAL'S ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN WAR.**  
(Canadian Press Despatch).  
PARIS, Aug. 21.—In preparation for Portugal's active participation in the war a Franco-British military mission will leave this city in a few days for Portugal. The French Government has designated Lieut.-Col. Paris, Major Grandin de L'Espervier and Lieut. Girardou. The British Government is sending Major General Barnardiston and Lieut. Gough-Cathoires and G. A. Robinson. These officers will co-operate with the Portuguese military authorities.

### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over sixteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Pre-emption—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

### Capt Fryatt Slain To Enrage England

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

LONDON, August 19.—Why Capt. Charles Algernon Fryatt was shot by the Germans in Belgium, after a hasty court martial, seems to be explained in an article in the Kreuzzeitung of Berlin, which comes to the London Daily Mail by way of Rotterdam.

As these despatches told, Capt. Fryatt of the British merchant steamer Brussels was captured and afterwards shot at Bruges for an attempt to sink a German submarine. Through American Ambassador Gerard at Berlin the British Foreign Office made a vain attempt to save Fryatt's life. Afterward, Viscount Grey, British Foreign Minister, called the execution "the judicial murder of a prisoner of war." Prof. Kruckman writes in the Kreuzzeitung: "Capt. Fryatt was murdered with the deliberate intention of exasperating British public opinion and of enabling pan-German Annexationists and anti-Bethmanites (opponents of the German Chancellor) to cry: "England will never forgive us now. We must fight her to the last drop of blood."

"Anyone who had taken the trouble to study the English character could not help saying when he received the news of Fryatt's execution: 'Now, we have burned our boats.'"

"This news is important, not because it satisfies our lust for revenge but because we know that whether we like it or not we have got to wade through the swamp. Nobody who knew England could be in the slightest doubt that the shooting of the English captain must produce the final development of the war into one of pitiless fighting to the bloodiest ends. By shooting Fryatt we have begun this new phase, and now there is no turning back."
