MOISTURE IN THE AIR

Many times people are troubled as winter comes on with a very annoying itching of the skin. This is often attributed to the heavier underwears, especially if it is wool, and that is the cause in some cases. Much more frequently, however, the cause is lack of sufficient moisture in the living rooms. It is not enough that we guard against too high a temperature. We must also watch lest the air become too dry and unwholesome for that reason. A hydrometer will show the degree of humidity and it should be kept at 50 or above. Most furnaces have a receptacle for water. There are on the market various kinds of receptacles to be attached to radiators, but anything that will hold water and present a broad surface for evaporation will answer the purpose equally well.

CAUSE OF COLDS

Besides the germ which is the exciting cause of the cold there are contributing causes, such as sudden exposure to cold, exposure to hot stuffy air, over feeding, failure of the organs of elimination (bowels and kidneys) to carry away all waste products, errors in clothing, over indulgence in alcohol stimulants.—Dr. W. A. Evans.
