### Gourlies Ltd. Moves To New Quarters

Gourlies Ltd., Summerside's oldest drug store, because of the sale of the Dalton building to Sinclair and Stewart Ltd., has moved to new quarters in another building owned by Mr. J. E. Dalton on the corner of Central and First Streets, which was formerly occupied by Mr. Milton Mellish who has moved his grocery business next door. Gourlies Ltd., has been on Water Street since 1868 and Mr. Dalton has been associated with Gourlies since 1905 and has been proprietor of the store since 1912. It was formerly known as the Prince County Drug Store. It was at first located on the site of the Prince Edward Island Fur Pool Ltd., and when the drug store was burned down by fire it was moved to the site of the Crabbie building on Water Street. From 1916 to 1930, after the second great fire in Summerside, the drug store was located in the Clifton Hotel building. After the completion of the Dalton brick building in 1930 the store was since then in business there. Improvements are to be made to the premises where the store is now located and the good wishes of his many friends will be extended to Mr. Dalton for continued success.—S.

### St. Patrick's Play Grand Success
