A BIG COLLECTION.

OLD ORCHARD, Me., Aug. 14.—The collection taken today for foreign missions at the Christian Alliance camp meeting amounted to \$45,264 which is \$50 in excess of the foreign missions offering taken here a year ago. Most of the gifts were in pledges which the donors promise to redeem. There was an unusually large number of small offerings. Fourteen pledges ranged from \$1,000 to \$5,000 and 72 of the total 421 pledges covered all but \$5,000 of the total collection. There were no sensational scenes, no gifts of watches or rings as in some former years. Ten young women responded to the call for foreign missionary volunteers. The Christian Alliance convention will be concluded tomorrow.

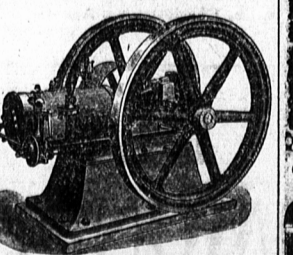

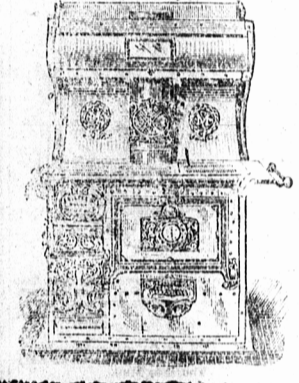

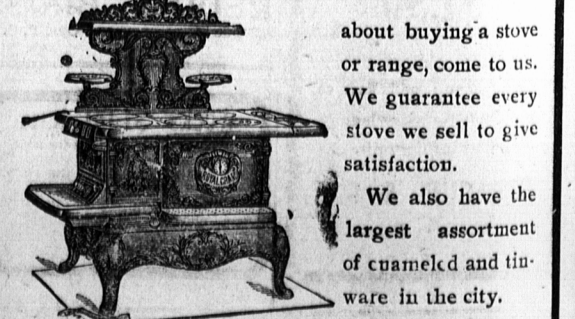
