PREMIER ASQUITH SOUNDS A NOTE OF WARNING.

There has been a long run of good times pretty much all over the world and such conditions do not last continually without occasional interruption. True, things are looking well in Canada at present. Trade is prosperous, industries busy, the public revenue still expanding and making new records and immigrants coming into the country in thousands. But in the old world some of the wise ones think they discern a cloud in the sky. Premier Asquith is quoted as saying to the bankers of England words which are intended to convey a warning which may be timely for other countries as well. He is thus reported: "Notwithstanding the country's prosperity, the signs in the industrial sky ought to warn you against complacent optimism. The railway and

coal strikes are especially significant phenomena, which make it the duty of the Government, and of business men and bankers alike, to look beneath the surface and study the economic fabric piecemeal." In the United States there are also railway and coal strikes, actual or impending, while like portents in the industrial sky in France, Germany, Spain and Italy. An election year in the United States will not help matters there and Canada sustains very close commercial and industrial relations with her next neighbor. Agitators and demagogues are apt to be busier than usual in election years. All of which gives a hint to Governments and to bankers in Canada as elsewhere to watch the signs of the times a little more closely than has been necessary in the immediate past.

A CENTURY OF PEACE.

In this warring world it is pleasant to recall that it is now more than fifty-seven years since Great Britain has been embroiled in war with any of the great powers of the world. Her last war with a great European power was with Russia in 1854-6, which practically ended with the fall of Sebastopol in the last-named year. And in that struggle the Mother Country was not engaged alone but had as allies Turkey, France and Sardinia. And that was before the days of the modern steel-clad fleets and almost before the days of steam as applied to war vessels. In fact the rifle had only begun to take the place of the old musket when the Crimean war was fought.

Britain and France had fought many bloody wars in the olden times, but since the fall of Napoleon at Waterloo in 1815 Britain and France have never engaged in war with each other. Their relations have been for a good while past of the friendliest and both are now looking forward to the celebration of a centenary of peace in 1915. With the United States the centenary year is a little nearer than with France. It comes in 1914 and all the branches of the English-speaking world are looking forward to a notable celebration of the auspicious anniversary. During the long and happy peace between Britain, France and the United States an enormous commerce has developed which must tend powerfully to prevent the outbreak of war between them in the future. Arbitration, too, has come in, and war between these powers seems almost unthinkable at the present time.

NOTES.

The death of Lady Tupper, wife of Sir Charles Tupper, Baronet, will be learned with regret by a wide circle throughout Canada and the British Empire. Lady Tupper was before her marriage Miss Frances Morse, daughter of Silas Hibbert Morse, Esq., of Amherst. They were married in 1846 and so had lived together happily for nearly sixty-six years. Few married couples have the fortune to be so long spared to each other. Sir Charles Tupper is the second son of this union, the elder son, Stewart Tupper, K. C., a prominent lawyer of Winnipeg, being the heir to the baronetcy which Sir Charles Tupper holds. The deceased Lady Tupper was held in very high esteem by all to whom she was known, the worthy partner of one of the most eminent men that Canada has yet produced.

A NATURAL INDUSTRY IN NOVA SCOTIA.

The Nova Scotia Clay Works, Limited, Has Combined Seven Brick-Making Plants in this Province Output 25,000,000 a Year.

The brick-making industry is one pre-eminently well adapted to Nova Scotia. The Province has the clay deposits and the transportation facilities by water no less than by rail to give easy access to very extensive markets and in an article like brick, favorable transportation is a matter of special importance.

The industry in the past has been proved profitable in Nova Scotia, in spite of the fact that there were many competing yards, each operating in a small way and with insufficient capital.

The Nova Scotia Clay Works, Limited, has been organized to combine seven yards, operating the most profitable of these, giving to the entire brick-making industry the advantage of one management, expert business methods and ample capital. In the meantime the demand is so great that all the yards have to be kept going. R. Macdonald, an old brick-maker, is the Vice-President of the Nova Scotia Clay Works. He says 25,000,000 brick can be made and sold annually by the company's plants. The net profit on this output, at \$2 a thousand, will be \$50,000, or more than 9 per cent for depreciation and dividends on the common stock. The issued capital is \$300,000 of 7 per cent preferred stock and \$300,000 common. F. B. McCurdy and Company are offering the preferred at par, with a substantial bonus of common, and it looks as if the issue would be over-subscribed before the date fixed for closing the lists.
