500 sheep, 500 barrels oysters and 200 bags potatoes were the principal shipments by the Northumberland yesterday morning.

## THE MARKETS.

There was a fair attendance at the market yesterday. Produce was plentiful in all lines and prices were but slightly changed from previous market.

The price of eggs remains at 22 and 23c and butter at 22 and 24c.

Poultry was well supplied, chickens bringing from 45 to 60c a pair, ducks each 40 to 60c, geese, 70 to 95c, and wild geese 85 to 90c.

Pork, dressed weight, according to quality sold at 47 to 65c.

The price of potatoes was from 20c to 25c per bus, oats, white, brought 40c and black 41c. Hay per cwt sold from 70 to 75c and pressed \$13.50.

## MARKING THE BOUNDARY.

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 5.—Dr. R. A. Daly, of the geological survey, has returned to his office after a summer spent in the field in the region of the international boundary between British Columbia and the State of Washington. Dr. Daly is engaged in working out structural section along the line of the boundary and in doing so has to survey a belt from five to ten miles in width and extending on both sides of the border. The location of the boundary is being carried on by Messrs. J. J. McArthur and C. Biggar under the superintendence of Mr. King, chief astronomer. Dr. Daly states that the Americans, who are doing a share of the work, have begun to put up their monuments. They are of alumina bronze and are established chiefly on summits, so as to be intervisible. The metal is eight feet high and is set in a cubic bed of concrete two feet each way. The parties this summer were severely handicapped by the heavy smoke from forest fires, the summer in the Rocky Mountains having been unusually dry. For days at a time the transit men had to lay off and wait for the atmosphere to clear. During the summer Dr. Daly has been working over a territory forty-two miles east of the Cascade Mountains and sixty-five miles between the two crossings of the Kootenay River east of the Southern Selkirk.
