WAGE CUTS ANNOUNCED.—The wages of the employees of the Canadian Vickers, Ltd., Montreal, may be reduced fifteen per cent, and unless more orders are received shortly there will be an extensive curtailment, the management announces. The men have been asked to accept a cut. The men request that the reduction be limited to ten per cent.

AUSTRALIA'S COMPETITION FOR IMMIGRATION.—A campaign of competition with Canada for immigration from the British Isles will be launched by the Australian Government on March 1st. After that date Australia will offer a grant of \$60 sterling towards the cost of the total third-class fare of \$100 to suitable emigrants from the United Kingdom. Of the remaining \$130, the Antipodean Government will lend another \$65, leaving only \$65 for the prospective citizen to pay himself.

A BUSY HEN.—A record yet to be beaten in continuous egg-laying, according to E. C. Elford, Dominion Poultry Husbandman, was made by a barred rock pullet at the Experimental Farm at Kentville, N.S. This pullet has laid 104 eggs in 104 days. As a rule a hen lays two or three days and then misses a day, and some are known to have laid five or six dozen without a break, but never before, in the knowledge of the Dominion Poultry Department, has a hen laid 104 eggs without a miss.

Hints for the Motorist BY ALBERT L. CLOUGH. TESTING CYLINDERS FOR GAS-TIGHTNESS. Put on The Hand-Crank Occasionally And See If Compression is Good. THE ENGINE SHOULD BE WARM when the test is made. Attach the hand-crank, remove the spark-plugs from all cylinders, except No. 1, see that the ignition is switched off and get the hand crank partly open. When cranked, the engine should turn perfectly freely through one and one-half rotations of its cycle, but on the other one-half rotation, the resistance to cranking should suddenly increase and become so great that considerable force is required to continue the movement. This resistance occurs when No. 1 piston is moving upward on its compression stroke, with both valves closed. The resistance should be of a springy character and should increase as the crank is moved, up to the end of the stroke. If cranking force is removed, the engine and crank should rock backwards strongly. The resistance produced should be sustained with little diminution, even though the crank is held stationary for several seconds, partway up the stroke not gradually force and even quite long continued, moderate cranking force, should not gradually force the piston through its stroke. There should be no hissing sound of escaping gas, while cranking, or anything more than a very gradual yielding of the springy resistance encountered. A cylinder has been tested and a record made of the results, the spark-plug should be removed from No. 1, screwed into No. 2 cylinder and that tested in the same manner—the rest of the cylinders being gone over in succession. A record of successfully passing the test, being described as "poor" and those in better condition "fair."

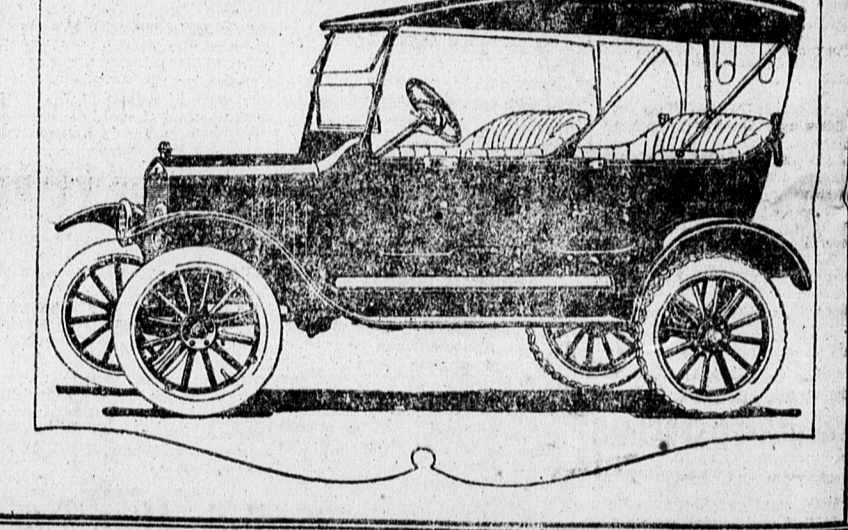
