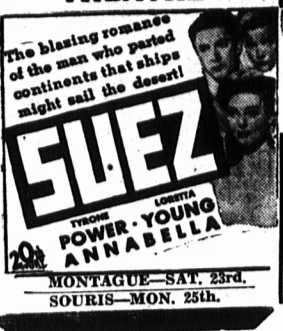

R. C. A. F. AIRSHIP MISSING SINCE SEPT 14

OTTAWA, Sept. 21-A Northrop Delta Aircraft of the R. C. A. F., flown by Pilot Sergeant J. E. Doan and leading aircraftman D. A. Rennie, has been missing since leaving Megantic, Que., Sept. 14th. enroute to a Maritime Province station, the Defence Department announced today. The missing craft, which was being flown from Ottawa to an air station on the Atlantic seaboard, has not been reported since leaving Megantic and an aerial search is being conducted. The two men were supplied with emergency rations and equipment necessary to sustain themselves if forced down in an isolated region. On the day the plane left Megantic there were reports of an airplane passing over Rimouski and Matapedia, in Quebec.

ISSUE ORDER TO DISGORGE SUGAR BOARD

OTTAWA, Sept. 21-The War-time Prices and Trade Board, under chairmanship of Hector B. McKinnon, moved swiftly today to curb hoarding of sugar. In the one day, the board announced tonight its officers obtained voluntary release of approximately 2,000,000 pounds of sugar "from industrial plants which had bought their sugar supplies several months ago". The sugar has been turned back by these companies to the sugar refiners for distribution through the regular trade channels, the Board said. In letters from Halifax to Vancouver, officers of the Dominion Weights and Measures Service have been directed to call on retail grocery stores to find out to what extent excessive purchases by individual householders have made it difficult for others to secure adequate supplies," the Board announced. Legal and police officers are studying evidence in several cities which, it is expected, "may result in the laying of charges of hoarding and profiteering."

Meat Ring 2 lbs. ground beef 1 lb. ground pork 1 cup bread crumbs 2 teaspoons horseradish 2 teaspoons salt 1 large onion, minced 1 green pepper, cut fine 2 eggs 1-2 cup catsup Method: This makes a good-sized ring, but you can make half of it, if your mould is smaller, or your family. Mix both kinds of meat and I generally buy a piece of the chuck for the beef and shoulder for the pork. Add the seasonings, finely minced onion and green pepper and the bread crumbs which have been dampened with warm water. Work in the egg yolks and the catsup and mix well, then fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Pack this into a ring mould which has been very thoroughly greased and bake in a moderate 350 deg. F oven for 1-1 1/2 hours. Unmould carefully and fill the centre with hot buttered new beefsteak or carrots. Or fill the centre with the carrots and arrange the beefsteak around the edge of the ring. All Weighed In If you do a great deal of canning and preserving, you will find this preserving kettle and make a note of them in your cook book.
