Egg Production In Province Continues Heavy

Egg production continues heavy for the season of the year, last week's receipts being above the quantity received for the same period last year, the Dominion Department of Agriculture, eggs and poultry market report said today. Issued by Mr. F. M. Nash, senior poultry products inspector, the report said the quality is good but some eggs are being classified Grade "B" due to discoloured yolks and weak whites or albumen due to hens running at large. Two such green food consumed by hens contributes largely to this condition found in eggs at this season of the year. This quality egg is not desired by the consumer therefore is graded "B" and discounted in price according to the consumer's preference.

The production of discoloured, yolk eggs is economically unsound as these eggs are discounted in price as much as seven or eight cents per dozen. Fed prices being high, it is tempting to allow hens to range and pick up their food. Hens require a certain amount of green food and this food can reduce the cost of feeding considerably without much loss in quality. If hens are kept confined to the house daily until three p.m., fed liberally with a good laying manure and then allowed to range after this hour.

Canada, as well as Prince Edward Island, still has a surplus of eggs over domestic requirements. This condition necessitates the export of the surplus in different forms to Great Britain and does set the price being paid for eggs throughout Canada. Present paying prices will not fluctuate very much until production drops or when we again commence moving eggs to Britain in shell, September 1st, when prices will increase some seven cents per dozen. Many predict prices will rise before this date.

Operators of grading stations continue to quote for ungraded eggs A Large 37-8, A Medium 35-4-36, B 28-31, C 18-20 and selling the graded product to wholesalers for their stations A Large 42, A Medium 40, B 36-4. Wholesalers are quoting retailers for the graded cartoned pack A Large 48, A Medium 46, B loose 40 and in turn eggs are retailing to consumers cartoned A Large 52-5, A Medium 50-3, B loose 45-7.

The poultry market is quiet. Some broilers and fowl are being ordered. Broilers and fowl which have completed their lay, are now marketed in other parts of Canada. The market for fowl is strong and prices are considerably higher than last year, particularly prices paid by dealers shipping to the

Appeal Cases At Georgetown

Four appeal cases came before the Supreme Court at Georgetown yesterday, by Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy presiding. The cases were disposed of as follows:

The King, respondent, vs. Borden Munn, appellant. Appeal from a conviction for drunken driving before Stipendiary Magistrate Jos. W. MacDonald in July, 1947. Appeal disallowed and magistrate's conviction upheld. The Attorney General and S. S. Hessian, K.C., for respondent; R. R. Bell, K.C., for appellant.

Laurence McPhee, respondent, vs. Henry Pope, appellant. Appeal from the Magistrate's conviction for assault. Lester O'Donnell for respondent, Mr. Bell for appellant. Case adjourned to July term.

The King, respondent, vs. Walter J. MacDonald, appellant. Appeal from a conviction under the Highway Traffic Act. Attorney General and Mr. Hessian for respondent; Mr. Bell for appellant. Appeal dismissed and Magistrate's decision confirmed.

John Hooper, respondent, vs. Albert Griffin, appellant. Appeal from a conviction, in debt, case heard before Judge Trainor in the King's County Court. E. B. Trainor for respondent, Mr. Bell for appellant. Judgment of lower court upheld and appeal dismissed.

The Court adjourned sine die.

Rev. C. D. Henderson the minister conducted the service and brought the message. He preached on the theme "Jesus the way of Life" from John 14:1-6. He referred to the preparation the departed one had made in this life for the next, and our need to do likewise.

He was assisted in the service by Rev. R. L. Hiscock of Murray River Pentecostal Tabernacle, both also taking part at the grave side. Mr. Hiscock read the nineteenth psalm a favorite of the deceased.
