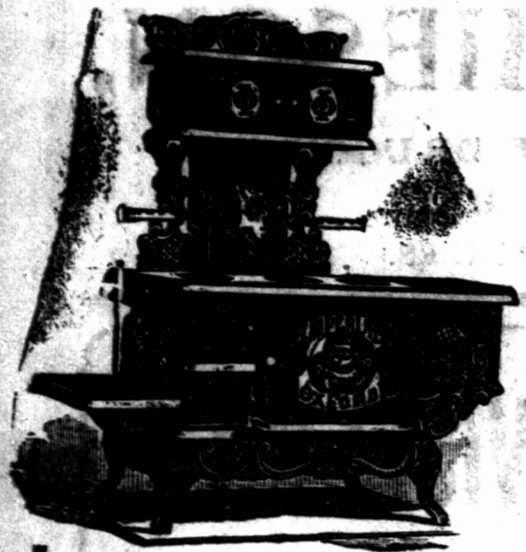

There is one thing that Mr. Tarte has effected for himself and the country by his bold advocacy of protection. He has put a stop for the time to the savage attacks upon him by the Conservative press. Some of their number have lapsed into silence, others are mildly critical while few commend his attitude. All are waiting to hear what the Premier and the colleagues of Mr. Tarte will have to say and do when they all get back to Ottawa and have to take counsel together over the strange situation.

A political crisis has arisen in the state of Victoria, Australia, growing out of the hard times. Although the colony has only about 1,200,000 people the expenditure is nearly \$40,000,000 a year. The Government owns and operates the larger part of 3,200 miles of railway and the wages of the officials and men employed on the railways form a large part of the annual expenditure. The Government in its efforts to retrench reduced the railway men's pay, whereupon they went on strike and brought all their influence to bear upon the Legislature. The result was that a majority of the House voted against the Government's scheme of retrenchment. A dissolution followed and the railway men are making a fight to have men elected who will support their former rate of pay. The incidents show one of the drawbacks of Government ownership in creating an official class too numerous and influential to be controlled.

**GERMAN CROWN PRINCE.**

SIMLA, India, Sept. 19.—Much interest has been aroused in India by the announcement that the Crown Prince of Germany, Frederick William, is likely to accompany the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, who are to represent King Edward and Queen Alexandra at the coronation Durbar.
