Diet for Baby Turks.

When the poulters are hatched give each of the youngsters a grain of black pepper, put them back under the hen and do not disturb them for twenty-four hours. Now give the hen a coop slatted at each end to allow the poulters to wander in and out during the day. The coop is closed at night and moved each day. This method prevents the mother from tiring them out, leading them through wet grass and provides a fresh roosting place which is very essential.

The first feed should consist of fine sharp grit, then in a couple of hours feed them infertile eggs boiled hard and chopped fine or pinhead oatmeal, feed every three or four hours a little at a time. Keep them supplied with fine charcoal. After the fifth day they are able to eat cracked wheat or oats with chopped onion tops. When from four to six weeks old they will be able to eat whole grain. From now on in good weather they will need only a little grain in the evenings which will bring them home at night and keep them tame. They will get their food in the fields until the cold weather comes, after that they should be fed at the corn they will eat to prepare them for market.

Keep Feet Dry. Be careful not to allow the young poulters to get wet if you can prevent it, and always try to have them housed during rain and thunder-storms. Should any of the youngsters become droopy pull out their big wing feathers and it is wonderful to see how chirpy they will become in a day or so. To prevent vermin apply a little vaseline under the wings. If present apply the vaseline mixed with lard.

Turkeys are subject to several diseases such as cholera, roup, blackhead, etc. These can be prevented by keeping the birds healthy with roosting places out in the open also by using clean food and fresh water. The most common disease is cholera and that is brought on by the way they are fed. In the first place never allow them to drink stagnant water, such as they get in the fall when streams are low or around the stable, etc. Do not over feed.

Inbreeding is a thing that turkeys cannot stand, therefore it is imperative that you obtain new blood each time to mate the young
