WINNIPEG, May 25 —(CP)—Good buying by commission houses and exporters prompted by yester-day's advance on United States markets brought gains of more than 1 cent to Winnipeg wheat futures prices in early trading to-day but selling developed as the session progressed and erased part of the rise. At the close quotations were 5-8-4 cent higher, with May at 64 5-8, July 65 3-4-7-8 and Oct. 67 cents. Chicago values moved a little lower while Buenos Aires was unchanged to 5-8-4 ahead.

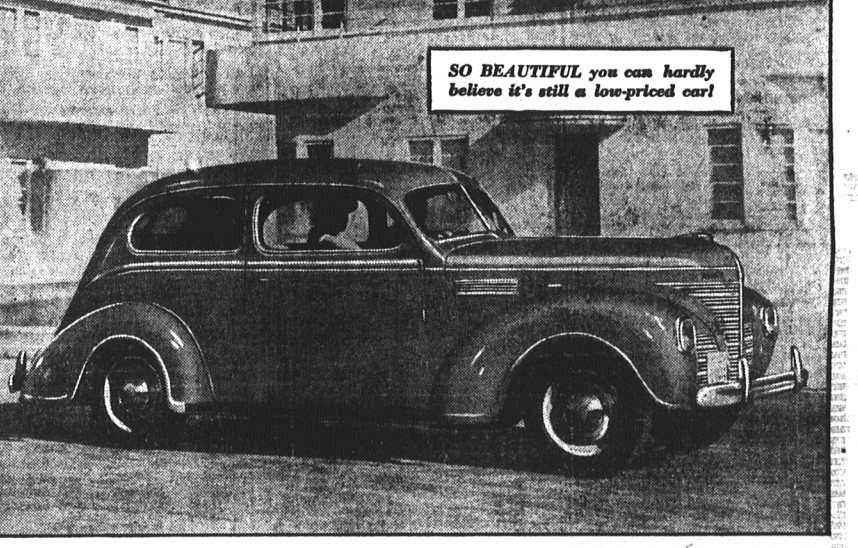

PROVES WOMEN PEN ODYSSEYS

Winnipeg, May 26—Randolph Patton, reviewing Dr. Cora Hind's latest book "My Travels and Findings," says: "Samuel Butler, author of Erewhon and The Way of All Flesh, once published a translation of the Odyssey in an attempt to prove that the original of that great poem had been written, not by Homer, but by a woman. "Miss Hind has lent some colour to Butler's theory by proving that women can not only write Odysseys but have 'em. "The preface she devotes to an eloquent and moving tribute to Haras, Shevchenko, the great Ukrainian poet, because his statue at Kharkov was the most impressive monument she saw in all the world. "The preface has nothing at all to do with the book, except that it has everything to do with a book that opens with a chapter on how to remove ink stains with ripe tomatoes and is illuminated on every page with a passion which the Ukrainian People's Poet himself would have admired. "That passion might be called the passion for housekeeping in the great sense for it is rooted in an appreciation of the devotion and service of farm women and of homemakers everywhere. The desire to establish and maintain order and peace and cleanliness is surely fundamental to all our lives, and we are all beneficiaries of women's unrewarded patient toil. "The extension of the principles of good housekeeping to a world which seems every day to become a little more mad has in fact been Dr. Cora's life work."
