**Stock Markets At A Glance**

TORONTO, June 11 — (CP) — The mining groups moved ahead today on Toronto Exchange. The Base Metals advanced 1.96 and the golds 1.55 in the index, both touching new highs for the last five to eight years.

MONTREAL, June 11 — (CP) — Sparked by strong spots, most pivotal groups were pegged at new highs in the indices after trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market as firmness marking transactions last week was amplified on new eight-year tops as industrials and papers, golds were at their best in four years and banks since the average for the group was initiated last September. Golds were up in sympathy with New York and London.

NEW YORK, June 11 — (AP) — Buyers concentrated on motors and specialties in today's Stock Market while rails and many pivotal industrials stumbled over further selling.

Investment services still leaned toward caution because of the belief that recovery troubles had been far from discounted. Dividends, earnings and hopes some automotive manufacturers soon would get back to normal production helped individual factors.

The direction was murky from the start. Low-quoted issues accounted for the greater part of the volume. Prices offered around midday had slipped in the final hour with carriers in supply. Transfers of 1,490,000 shares compared with 1,710,000 Friday.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was off 3 of a point at 65.7.

LONDON, May 31 — (CP) — Restoration of the world-famed Oval which was wrecked by the pillbox during the 1939, has started with an estimate that \$225,000 will be required for repairs before the ground will be ready for cricket in 1946.

The Oval suffered bomb damage during the German air raids on London. It also suffered from the erection of temporary buildings erected on concrete foundations since the ground was requisitioned by the War Office at the start of the war.
