New Wage Climb May Be Starting In U.S.

CLEVELAND, May 30—(AP)—The pay boost at General Motors may foreshadow a break in industry's "anti-inflation" program, the magazine Steel said today.
"Even though the steel industry does not abandon its anti-inflation program, it is generally agreed by observers that the recent wage advance in the automotive industry, coupled with increased production cost... will tend to slow further steel price reductions.
However, steel consumers generally regard prices secondary to available supply, for demand still runs far ahead of output, added Steel.
Tending to make the demand-supply situation even tighter, the magazine went on, is the prospect that 4,000,000 tons will be channelled into assistance programs, such as atomic energy projects and for home heating equipment.

U.S. Markets Go On Summer Schedule

NEW YORK, May 30—(AP)—The New York stock and curb exchanges and all other security markets in the United States were closed Saturday, starting the summer schedule that will keep them idle on Saturdays through September. The Chicago Board of Trade operated as usual.
All markets will be closed next Monday in observance of United States Memorial Day.

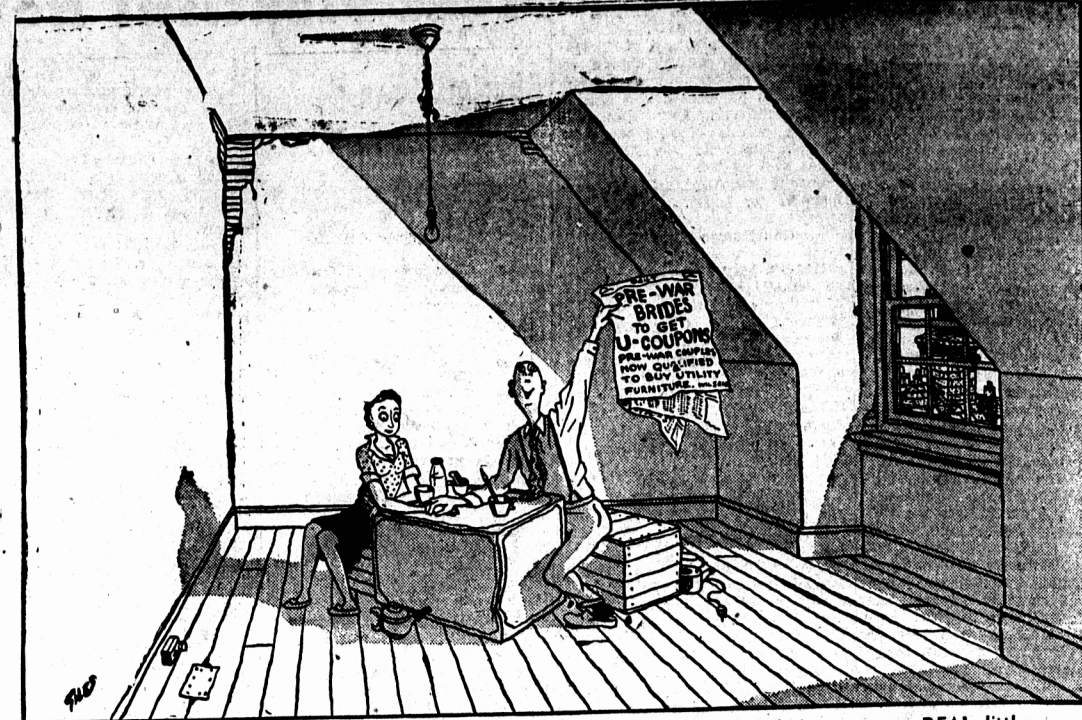

Among those Island hog breeders who have sold swine for this consignment are Mr. James Halliday of Newton Cross and Mr. John Thompson of Dunstaffnage. Mr. Halliday received the sum of \$200. for a two-year-old sow, Eastside Nell SA, and Mr. Thompson received \$150. for a high class, pure bred young sow. Both animals were purchased by Mr. W. Hunter of St. Anne de Bellevue for J. R. Popham of Chesterville, Ont.
More than half the consignment of two cars has been bought by the Burns Packing Company at Calgary, Alta. It is understood the shipment will be made within the next few weeks.

WINNIPEG, May 30—(CP)—Oats and barley futures showed a good tone on fair demand by eastern processors during active trade Saturday on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.
May oats reached the new seasonal high of \$1.05 1-2, while the other futures scored modest gains. Offerings were liberal but well absorbed.
May rye declined the two-cent limit on commission house selling while the July future advanced on a few buying orders.
Class two wheat prices were reduced one cent from Friday.
