## MURDER OF QUONG SING, THE CHARGE

### On Which Cyrus L. Ryan of Charlottetown

#### Is Held in Plymouth, Mass. Government Case is Well Advanced in Trial—The District Attorney's Charge.

PLYMOUTH, June 8.—The government opened its case in the trial of C. L. Ryan, who is accused of murder, at 9 o'clock yesterday. The accused, when he entered the dock, appeared smilingly confident as ever.

In his opening, Dist. Atty. French said the object of the murder was robbery. The prisoner in the dock he said, was the last man who saw Quong Sing alive. He said Ryan earned \$9 a week and paid \$4.25 for board, and \$1.75 for the board of his sweetheart, Katie Murray. His wages were assigned to a Boston credit house, leaving him without any ready money. The Chinaman owned a revolver and a cheap watch. They were missing, but the searchers found a box of cartridges, from which three were gone. When Ryan was taken, a revolver with three new cartridges in the cylinder was found in his possession. After his arrest he was hauled to Miss Murray, his sweetheart, a watch and half of bill. On the noon of the day of the murder Ryan paid certain bills in Hanover. This was shortly before he left town.

Plans and photographs of the premises were shown, and physicians testified to the condition of Quong Sing's body when found. Wounds resembling finger marks were found on the neck and the heart was ruptured. They declared death due to drowning. The Chinaman was found with his head thrust into a tub of water.

Fred W. Pierce, half-brother of Ryan, with whom the latter lived, testified that he knew defendant's wages at the rubber mill had been stopped about two weeks before the murder. Never saw revolver in Ryan's possession. Had seen him take a watch from his pocket, but never examined it. On cross-examination nothing of importance was elicited.

Mrs. Mary Ann Pierce, wife of the preceding witness, testified that Ryan paid \$4.25 a week for his board and \$1.75 a week for Miss Murray's board. On the day of the murder Ryan owed for two weeks' board. Witness was waiting to take the 2:15 train for Boston, in company with defendant and Miss Murray, when she first heard that the Chinaman had been killed. Ryan paid witness money that day, and paid the fares of the party to Boston.

Henry B. Snell testified that he was a barber at Hanover. There was only a board partition between quarters occupied by the Chinaman and his own. Witness saw Ryan in the laundry on the morning of Jan. 28. In consequence of what was told witness he went to the laundry. The outer door was open; an iron lay on a half ironed shirt, a trunk was open. Quong Sing lay in a tub of water; a box was on his shoulder. The tub was filled within two inches of the top. The victim's face was under the water. Had seen a watch in the Chinaman's possession. Cross examined, he said he never saw a revolver in the laundryman's possession.

William E. Handry testified to seeing Ryan on the street at about 9 o'clock Jan. 28; saw him in the laundry at 11:55 standing by the counter.

William B. Paxton testified that he had a market in the same building with Quong Sing. Never saw Ryan before the day of the murder. On that day saw him on the platform in front of the building. Saw him in the laundry as late as 11:55. Went to dinner and saw Chinaman in his wash room eating. Returned from dinner at 1 o'clock. The door of the laundry was ajar. Went into Snell's place and with him went into the laundry. Found the Chinaman lying in the tub of water. Knew that he had a revolver. The iron on the Chinaman's work bench was hot when the two men entered.

PLYMOUTH, June 9.—The government put on a large number of witnesses yesterday at the trial of Cyrus L. Ryan, charged with the murder of Quong Sing at Hanover, January 28.

Several persons testified to seeing Ryan at the Chinaman's laundry between 11 and 12 o'clock on the day of the murder. Others said they saw him hurrying towards Curtis Crossing early on the afternoon of that day and that he took the 2:15 train there.

It was brought out that he tried to hire a carriage at a stable early in that afternoon, but could not, as the stable-keeper was too busy to get it ready.

A Yukon Exhibit. The Yukon is becoming conscious of its attractions, and already appreciates the value of advertising. The Dawson News says: Yukon Territory is entitled to space in the Dominion grant at St. Louis for an exhibit. The idea of having an exhibit of Yukon Territory products at the World's Fair at St. Louis is believed by Elgin Schoff, one of the promoters, to be one of the best schemes ever evolved for the advertising of the Yukon, and he feels that the Dominion Government certainly will lend its aid.

The Yukon, I estimate, can make a creditable showing with less than \$50,000. Perhaps \$15,000 would make a fine exhibit. The question of money for the Yukon Territory exhibit will be taken up with the Dominion Government soon. The Yukon Horticultural Society has delegated me to confer with Ottawa on the matter. I may go to Ottawa. At any rate, I shall press the matter, and hope for success.

Many fine exhibits of grains, grasses, potatoes and fruits raised in the Yukon, specimens of gold from different creeks, woods, coal, mammoth and other prehistoric bones, Indian collections and the like will help to make the exhibit interesting.
