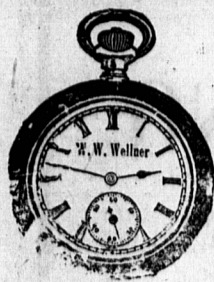

Beginning next Monday, May 1st, the Eastern Steamship Co. Passengers arriving in St. John on evening previous to sailing can go direct to steamer and take cabin berth or stateroom for the trip.

At the third annual convention of the New Brunswick Teachers' Association this week the salary schedule and declaration of December last were unanimously adopted. They pledge themselves not to underbid each other and rigidly adhere to the following schedule:

Males, class I, superior or grammar school, \$300.
Males, class II, \$240.
Males, class III, \$170.
Females, class I, superior or grammar school, \$300.
Females, class I, in common schools, \$175.
Females, class II, \$165.
Females, class III, \$130.

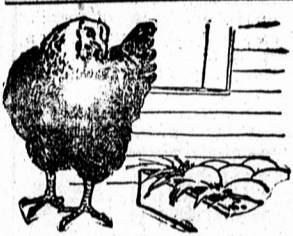
