She did not hesitate a minute, but hurried into a rubber coat and said she was ready for the trip.

Beachey headed straight up the lake, staying on the water for about a hundred yards. He then tilted the control and they were off the water in no time. After climbing to about a thousand feet, Beachey made one of his sensational turns that made the watchers gasp with astonishment. He then made a dip at a man in a motor boat, nearly causing that interested watcher to take a header in the lake.
