## Rates Of Duty Under New Customs Tariff

OTTAWA, Sept. 18.—The several enumerations of goods, respectively and the several rates of duties of customs giving the new British preferences, intermediate and general tariffs, respectively, as announced by Premier Bennett in the House of Commons are as follows: "N. O. P." is a contraction for Not Otherwise Provided For).

### Livestock and Meats

Horses, over one year old, valued at \$100 or less per head each—\$10.00, \$12.50, \$25.00.

Animals, living N. O. P.

(a) Cattle per pound—free—2 cents—3 cents.

(b) Sheep, lambs and goats per head—free—\$2.00—\$3.00.

(c) N. O. P.—free—20 p. c.—25 p. c.

Live hogs per pound—free—1 1/4 cents—2 cents.

Meats, fresh, N. O. P.

(a) Beef and veal per pound—2 cents—2 1/2 cents—6 cents.

(b) Lamb and mutton per pound—2 cents—2 1/2 cents—6 cents.

(c) Pork per pound—2 cents—2 1/2 cents—3 cents.

(d) N. O. P. per pound—2 cents—2 1/2 cents—6 cents.

Meats, prepared or preserved, other than canned.

(a) Bacon, hams, shoulders and other pork per pound—free—1 1/4 cents—3 1/4 cents.

(b) N. O. P. per pound—free—3 cents—6 cents.

### Agricultural Products, etc.

Eggs in the shell per dozen—2 cents—2 1/2 cents—10 cents.

Eggs, whole, egg yolk or egg albumen, frozen or otherwise prepared, N. O. P. whether or not sugar or other material be added per pound—5 cents—10 cents—11 cents.

Butter per pound—8 cents—12 cents—14 cents.

Peanut butter per pound—4 cents—6 cents—7 cents.

Hops per pound—12 cents—20 cents—24 cents.

Oats per bushel—free—9 cents—18 cents.

Oatmeal and rolled oats per one hundred pounds—free—50 cents—80 cents.

Rye per bushel—free—9 cents—15 cents.

Wheat per bushel—free—12 cents—30 cents.

Wheat flour and semolina per barrel—free—50 cents—\$1.35.

Flowers and foliage, natural, cut whether in designs or bouquets, or not—free—free—40 p. c.

Potatoes, including sweet potatoes.

(a) In their natural state per one hundred pounds—free—free—75 cents.

### Various Groceries

(b) Dried, desiccated, or dehydrated per pound—free—free—2 1/2 cents.

Soups, soup rolls, Tablets, cubes or other soup preparations, N. O. P.—15 p. c.—25 p. c.—35 p. c.

Figs, dried, plums, prunes and dates, dried, unpeeled per pound—free—1/4 cents—2-3 cent.

Dates, N. O. P. per pound—1 cent—1 1/4 cents—2 1/2 cents.

Cocoanut, desiccated, sweetened or not per pound—5 cents—6 cents—8 cents.

Anchovies, sardines, sprats, pilchard and herring, packed in oil or otherwise, in sealed tin containers, the weight of the tin container to be included in the weight for duty.

(a) When weighing over twenty ounces and not over thirty-six ounces each per box—3 1/4 cents—3 cents—6 cents.

(b) When weighing over twelve ounces and not over twenty ounces each per box—1 1/2 cents—4 cents—4 1/2 cents.

(c) When weighing over eight ounces and not over twelve ounces each per box—2 cents—3 cents—3 1/4 cents.

(d) When weighing eight ounces each or less per box—1 1/4 cents—2 cents—2 1/2 cents.

### Printed Matter

Advertising and printed matter, viz advertising pamphlets, advertising show cards, illustrated advertising periodicals; price books, catalogues and price lists; advertising almanacs and calendars, patent medicine or other advertising circulars, fly sheets or pamphlets, advertising chromos, chromo-type, oleographs or like work produced by any process other than hand painting or drawing, and having advertisement or advertising matter printed, lithographed or stamped thereon or attached thereto, including advertising bills, folders and posters, or other similar artistic work, lithographed, printed or stamped on paper or cardboard for business or advertisement purposes, N. O. P. per pound—10 cents—12 1/2 cents—15 cents.

der the general tariff rate, the duty shall be not less than—35 p. c.

Provided, that on the goods specified in item 178 and imported by mail on and after first day of July, 1914, duties may be paid by customs revenue stamps, under regulations by the minister, at the rates specified in said item, except that on each separate package weighing not more than one ounce the duty shall be each—1 cent—1 cent—1 cent.

Provided, further, that on and after first day of October, 1930, the duty under this item shall be each—2 cents—2 cents—2 cents.

### Internal Combustion Engines

The governor in council may by orders-in-council direct that there be substituted for tariff item 408m in Schedule A of the customs tariff, 1907 and the several rates of duties of customs set opposite said item in Schedule A, the following:

Internal combustion traction engines for farm purposes, valued at not more than fourteen hundred dollars each; traction attachments designed and imported to be combined with automobiles in Canada for use as traction engines for farm purposes, and complete parts of all the foregoing—free—free—free.

From and after the publication of such order-in-council in the Canada Gazette, tariff item 408M as it appears in said schedule at the time of the passing of this act shall be repealed and the provisions of the said tariff item as it appears in the last preceding subsection of this section shall be substituted therefor.

The governor in council shall not direct that such provisions be substituted as aforesaid unless and until the governor in council is satisfied that internal combustion traction engines for farm purposes, valued at not more than fourteen hundred dollars each and traction attachments such as are described in the aforesaid tariff item 408M are being manufactured in substantial quantities in Canada.

Portable engines with boilers, in combination, for farm purposes; horse powers and traction engines for farm purposes, N. O. P., and complete parts for all the foregoing—free—15 per cent—25 per cent.

Pasteurizers for dairying purposes and complete parts thereof—free—15 per cent—25 per cent.

Refrigerator, domestic or store, of all kinds, completely equipped or not—20 per cent—27 1/2 per cent—30 per cent.

### Washing Machines

Washing machines, domestic, with or without motive power incorporated therein; complete parts of washing machines—15 per cent—25 per cent—35 per cent.

Fire engines and other fire extinguishers, sprinklers, sprinkler heads of automatic sprinkler systems for fire protection—22 1/2 per cent—30 per cent—35 per cent.

Lawn mowers—20 per cent—30 per cent—32 1/2 per cent.

Traction engines and complete parts thereof N. O. P.—free—15 per cent—25 per cent.

### Hollow-Ware

Hollow-ware, of iron or steel, coated or not, N. O. P.—20 per cent—27 1/2 per cent—30 per cent.

Kitchen and dairy hollow-ware of iron or steel, coated with tin, including cans for shipping milk or cream, not painted, japanned or decorated—20 per cent—27 1/2 per cent—30 per cent.

Hollow-ware, of iron or steel, coated with vitreous enamel—22 1/2 per cent—32 1/2 per cent—35 per cent.

Manufactures of tinplate, panted japanned, decorated or not, and manufactures of tin, N. O. P.—20 per cent—27 1/2 per cent—30 per cent.

Farm wagons, farm sleds, logging wagons, logging sleds, and complete parts thereof—free—15 per cent—25 per cent.

Children's carriages, sleds and other vehicles; complete parts of all the foregoing—22 1/2 per cent—30 per cent—35 per cent.

### Iron and Coal

Notwithstanding the provisions of tariff item 442, materials or commodities as hereunder defined so described when imported by manufacturers for use exclusively in the manufacture, in their own factories, of the goods enumerated in tariff items 409A, 409B, 409C, 409D, 409E, 409F, 409G, 409J, 409O, 409P, and 439, under regulations prescribed by the minister:

- (1) Pig Iron—per ton—75 cents—\$1.25—\$1.25.
- (2) Bars or rods, of iron or steel, hot rolled, per ton—2.12 1/2 cents.
- (3) Apparatus designed for cooking or for heating buildings.
- (4) For coal or wood—15 per cent—25 per cent—30 per cent.
- (5) For gas—15 per cent—25 per cent—30 per cent.
- (6) For electricity—15 per cent—25 per cent—30 per cent.
- (7) For oil—15 per cent—25 per cent—30 per cent.
- (8) N. O. P.—15 per cent—25 per cent—30 per cent.
