## THE KING'S WARDROBE.

His Majesty is a Purple Lounge Suit—The King of England Sets Fashions for Well-Dressed Men.

The fashionable male world, and even to some extent the unfashionable also, is very much exercised in mind at the present moment as to whether there should not be some reform in masculine attire in the direction of more color and picturesqueness, particularly in regard to the lower garments and evening wear. A representative of "Tit-Bits" had an opportunity of discussing the question with those who have exceptional facilities for knowing what are King Edward's tastes and his desires in such matters.

It is well-known that the King sets the fashion not only to Great Britain but to the whole world everywhere. When he was at Marlborough the season before last and happened to appear, more by accident than design, two or three times in succession in a red necktie, the word went through all the hosiery departments in the capitals of Europe that red ties were the thing, and for weeks afterwards they were displayed in every shop window.

The King is very fastidious about the shape of the brims of his silk hats, and whenever he makes an alteration the fashionable world follows suit in the course of a very few weeks. His Majesty is also given at times to applying new ideas of his own to frock-coats, and was particularly successful a few seasons since with a single-breasted coat which had a chain fastening to keep it partially closed.

But, said our informant, His Majesty has not gone in for any important frock-coat changes for quite a long time now, and it may interest some people to know that until just recently he was wearing occasionally a garment that he had made for him about the time of the Coronation. This fact alone, he went on, will serve to show the absurdity of the idea that is entertained by some people that His Majesty only wears a suit two or three times and then discards it. As a matter of fact, all things considered, the King may be regarded as distinctly economical in respect to his tailoring. At the present time he probably possesses about two hundred suits of one sort and another, and about half the number of hats and caps.

In the ordinary course about thirty of these suits are taken off the active list in the course of each year, when they become the perquisites of his two assistant valets unless the King has previously signified, as he sometimes does, that they are to be bestowed upon some humble dependant who would be glad of them not merely because they were once worn by the monarch of England. These thirty suits would be replaced by thirty others, and it is probable that, what with extra overcoats and other matters, the King's tailor's bill amounts in the course of a year to between £400 and £500.

Whenever His Majesty is in need of a new suit, patterns of material are sent to him, he makes his choice, and the preliminaries of cutting and stitching are effected from the standard measurements. Then the suits is usually tried on by appointment in His Majesty's dressing-room at eleven in the morning. The King is extraordinarily quick to notice any imperfection or irregularity in the manner in which the tailor has carried out his special instructions. On one occasion a pair of trousers was accidentally made up from a material which was not exactly in accordance with the pattern which the King had chosen, though it resembled it very closely. The King noticed the difference at once.

His Majesty is by no means conventional in his sartorial ideas. If an idea strikes him for an improvement in clothes he does not care where or under what circumstances he sees it. For example, the tailor who has probably made more garments for the King than any other became introduced to His Majesty's custom in a curious manner.

One night, many years ago, he was at the Theatre watching the famous French player, Fechter, appearing in "Robert Macaire." The actor had to appear in clothes which were supposed to be torn and patched beyond recognition, and from a suit made by the Prince of Wales as he then was, noticed at once that all the same the garment was splendidly cut, and was, indeed, in its way quite a triumph of tailoring. Consequently, when the curtain descended he sent for Fechter and asked him who his tailor was. The actor mentioned the name of one in London, and he was immediately given a royal order, with many scores more to follow.

Again, all unsuspected, the King is often on the look-out for patterns of cloth which are particularly to his fancy, and he finds them in old places. On the occasion of the Braemar gathering two years ago he saw some brown tweed which pleased him very much, and from which he instantly decided to have a suit made. But he did not merely buy a suit length; he bought up the whole bale of the tweed, so that there was none left.

He did this for two reasons. In the first place, he desired to have the cloth by him for another suit if he should ever want one, and in the second he was wise enough to foresee that unless he took this precaution there would be at once a very vulgar run on the remainder of the cloth by the Times, Dicks and Harrys of the general public, which would conduce neither to his dignity nor theirs.

As showing again how unconventional is the King, it may be said that he does not often give a second thought as to what others will think if he is quite satisfied that an article of apparel is in perfectly good taste, and does not violate any of the canons of English dress. Not long since he was seen walking about the grounds of Windsor Castle wearing a purple lounge suit—probably the only one of its kind in England.—Tit-Bits.
