TOO MANY LEGISLATORS.

Canada has a good many law makers. First there is the Senate of 87 members, and the House of Commons with 214, soon to be increased to 221, which will give the two Houses a total membership of 308. Then there are the nine provincial Legislatures, which have some 466 members in all. This makes a grand total of 774 men who for a part of each year are engaged in the work of making laws.

Ontario has a Legislative Assembly of 97, Quebec an Assembly of 74 and a Legislative Council of 24, Nova Scotia a House of 41 and a Council of 21, while the single Houses of the other Provinces contain the following numbers: New Brunswick 46, Manitoba 41, British Columbia 42, Saskatchewan 25, to be at once increased to 41, Alberta 25 and Prince Edward Island 30.

In the Republic beside us the Legislatures are usually much larger than the Legislative bodies in the Provinces. Thus New Hampshire has a Senate of 24 members and a House of 389 members, a total of 413, or more than half as many as the members of our federal Parliament and all of our nine Legislatures taken together. Vermont has a Senate of 30 and a House of 245. In the more populous States this feature is not so marked. Pennsylvania has a House of 206, Illinois 150, Ohio 121.

All the State Legislatures are made up of two Houses each. The Canadian rule is to have a single House, though Quebec and Nova Scotia are exceptions to the rule. All our provincial Legislatures meet yearly at least and on rare occasions more frequently. Biennial sessions are the rule in the States, and forty-two of which have adopted the one-in-two-years session.

In the national Congress representatives have an average constituency of 200,000. A member of our House of Commons represents about 25,000 people. In the Legislature of New Hampshire there is one member for each 1,100 people; in our Island Legislature one to 3,500; in Nova Scotia one to 11,000; in Ontario one to 22,000.

These are wide contracts. Quebec and Ontario have but few more members in their Legislatures than they send to the House of Commons at Ottawa. This Island sends four to Ottawa and 39 to its Legislature—more than seven times as many. And there is New Hampshire, above referred to, which sends but two representatives to Congress and has a local House of 39.

In the British Parliament the average population of members' constituencies is over 60,000. If the United Kingdom had as many members in proportion to population as Prince Edward Island has in its Legislature the House of Commons would contain 12,000 members.

Leaving out the American example, this Province is out of line with the Canadian and British system of representation. If it were not for party fifteen members would be an ample number in our Assembly and three or four for the Executive. On that scale we could pay our members better, get a larger proportion of good men to serve, and with party spirit eliminated could have our public business transacted on business principles.

A House of fifteen men would still be larger in proportion to population than those of any of the older Provinces of Canada. But the party spirit which is so troublesome and costly is very difficult to eliminate.

We find it rather hot for political warfare even in our high northern latitude. What must it be in the over-heated Republic where a presidential conflict is raging and one of the candidates turns the scales at 300 lbs? Mr. Taft may well pray, "Oh that this too, too solid flesh would melt, thaw and resolve itself into a dew."

We really fear that the sanguine statistics of those who are estimating Canada's present population at seven millions are too hopeful. The gain between 1871 and 1881 was in round figures 700,000; between 1881 and 1891 it was 500,000, and between 1891 and 1901 it was 500,000. To have our present population even six millions is assuming that we have had a steady gain of 100,000 a year during seven years since 1891. Canada will do well if it tops the seven million mark by 1911 when the census will be next taken.

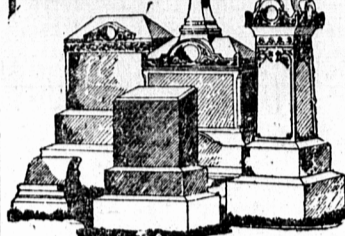
