Russians Back German Nationalists In Effort To Impose Own Peace Terms

BERLIN, May 16 — (AP) — Russia allied herself with German nationalism today in a drive to impose Moscow's peace terms on the Western Powers.

Eastern Germany was urged by its Communist rulers to roll up a mammoth "yes" vote today and tomorrow for the so-called German People's Congress.

When the Big Four foreign ministers convene in Paris May 23, that congress will act as a German mouthpiece for Russia's demands.

Of the 18,000,000 Germans in Soviet occupied territory the Communist front apparently expects at least 10,000,000 to vote "yes." All former Nazi Party members, whose franchise was taken away by denazification commissions, have been invited by East German Communists to participate in the election.
