THEORY VERSUS PRACTICE.

Dear Sir: On my return to Charlottetown this morning after attending the funeral of the late Captain Wisener, I found a third letter from Judge Fitzgerald on the subject of our road-making and his scraper.

I gave the Judge full credit for what his scraper was capable of doing and in his second letter he very plainly admitted that it was only capable of keeping certain roads in better repair. But he has not told the people how he would make the road or what machinery he would use to prepare it for his scraper. He has not attempted to explain to the public that there is anything better today than our road-maker of 8-horse-power which only costs the Province from \$185.00 to \$200.00. These machines that have done so much good work in the Province he was going to send to a museum without ever suggesting anything to us that would take their place. Then we would have to return to manual labor, with pick and shovel, the same as the people did fifty years ago. We have converted, practically speaking, all that labor into work done by horses and machinery; and for the information of the Judge I might say that we can now do as much work, in one day with our road-maker for \$14.00, as one hundred men would do the old way in the same time. The Judge apparently wishes to create the impression that these were old machines; and sooner than let them go to the junk heap they were sold cheap. I would like to suggest to His Honor that he peruse the Public Accounts of the Province of Nova Scotia and therein

he will find the amount of money expended for the past year on road machines and road-making. This present spring the agent of the firm we buy from, came here from Truro, after selling a whole carload of the same kind of machinery as we use, to the Province of Nova Scotia; I think this proves that we are keeping pace with the times in regard to road machinery.

The Judge states that we have expended \$7,977.52 since 1893 on road machines, and wonders if the people will smile when they learn of this expenditure. This statement sounds more like the tone of a politician sitting in opposition, than of a learned Judge of our Supreme Court of Judicature. As a matter of fact the people see the Public Accounts and know every year the amount voted and expended on road machines. Therefore, the Judge's information is stale and unprofitable.

For the sake of argument, if we introduced his scraper to put over the roads occasionally after they were made with the road-maker, we would have to purchase at least one scraper for every overseer who has a territory of more than three miles, where it would require to be used at least four times a year after rains. The cost then would be about \$10.00 in each precinct according to the scale of wages we are now paying. Now let us see the entire cost under that proposition. We have about 1,100 Overseers in the Province and at that rate, operating the scraper, would cost \$11,000 to which if you add the price of the scraper, at \$8.00 each, would be \$8,800 more, or exactly the snug sum of \$19,800 for the first year's experiment, a very large sum indeed for one year, whereas we only expended \$7,977.52 for the past seventeen years.

Mr. Fitzgerald questions my veracity. Well, I take exception to his memory. The conversation between us regarding the split log drag and the Ontario scraper took place about half way between the east corner of the Provincial Building and the Court House door and the facts as given in my second letter were correct.

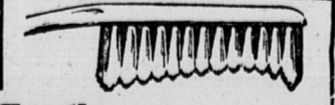

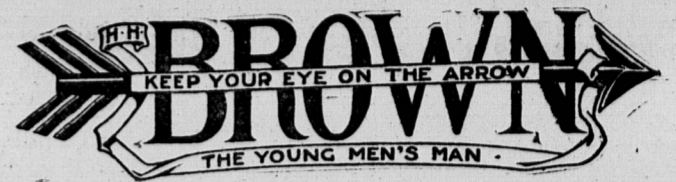
