Given Life Term On Murder Charge

(P. By Guardian's Special Wire)
 PORTLAND, Me., May 16 — A superior court jury tonight convicted Grover Parker, 47, of the murder of Miss Alice E. M. Witham, whom he accused of "driving a car into a living hell" by refusal to accept his proposal of marriage. The state charged, in a one-day trial, the mid-mannered dairy salesman shot and killed Miss

Witham and Ralph M. Flanders, 43 year old railroad ticket agent, outside the latter's apartment here April 2. Judge William H. Fisher immediately sentenced Parker, a former Presque Isle resident, to a life term in the Maine State prison — mandatory for a murder conviction under Maine law.

Five Members Of Steamer's Crew Dead

(By The Associated Press)
 LONDON, May 16—Five members of the crew of the American steamship City of Norfolk, of the Baltimore Mail Steamship Company, died at dusk Saturday as the result of a stabbing in the cook's galley, it was disclosed when the vessel docked here today.
 One man was stabbed to death, his alleged attacker jumped overboard, and three seamen were lost in rough seas during an attempt to rescue the man who jumped. The incident occurred near Bishop's Rock, at the entrance to the English Channel, as the vessel's 68 passengers were at dinner.
