TO LINK EMPIRE BY WIRELESS SYSTEM. LONDON, Aug. 22 - One of the first of the "Britians beyond the seas" to express willingness to participate in the scheme of Empire wireless stations for the purposes of Imperial defence as well as for commercial needs, is South Africa. Notification to this effect has reached the Imperial authorities.

The Union Government has selected a site at Pretoria, where a high-power station, similar to those which are to be installed in other parts of the Empire, will be built. General Botha, through Sir David Graham, notified the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Postmaster-General on Wednesday evening of the intention of his government, to defray the cost of the installation, which is estimated at \$400,000.

From the point of view of defence, the Union Government regards the scheme as highly important, for from the Pretoria station the administrative capital of the Union will by day and night, by means of its high-powered duplex station, receiving and transmitting at the same time and fitted with automatic apparatus, be in communication with both England and Australia.
